or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majetly's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

HIS Day the Lords being met, a Meffage was fent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarme, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attenuance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to bear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money out of the Confolidated Fund, for applying a certain Sum of Money therein mentioned, for the Service

Majesty's Islands of Guernscy, Jersey, Alderney, Sark of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninetyfour, and for further appropriating the Supplies granted in this S fion of Parliament.

An Act for granting to His Majest a certain Sum of

Money to be ra fed by a Lottery.

An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Duties of

Customs on Slate, Stone and Marble.

An Ast for granting to Majesty the Sum of Two Hundred Thousand Pounds, to be issued and paid to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, to be by them placed to the Account of the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt.

An Act for repealing jo much of an Act made in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as directs that no Cambrick or Lawn shall be imported from Ireland, until the Importation of Cambricks and French Lawns into Ircland shall be prohibited by Law; to allow the Importation of Cambricks and French Lawns from the Austrian Netherlands for a limited Time; for making more effectual an Act, made in the Twentyfourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for the more effectual Prevention of Smuggling in this Kingdom; and for preventing the fraudulent re-landing of Tobacco Shipped for Exportation.

jesty's Sugar Colonies in America, from the Jaid Colonics directly to Fereign l'arts, in Ships built in Great Britain, and navigated according to Law; and also so much of an Act, passed in the Fisteenth Year of the Reign of Ilis late Majesty, as amends the said Act.

An Act to amend an Act, paffed in the ligh Seffich of Parliament, intituled, An Act to provide for the Families of Persons chosen by Lot to serve in the Militia of this Kingdom, and of Substitutes serving therein; and to explain and amend an Act of Parliament, passed in the Twenty-fixeh Year of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for amending and reducing into Gne Act of Parliament the Laws relating to the Militia in that Part of Great Britain called England; and also an Act. made in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for augmenting the Militia.

An Act to continue an Act, made in the last Session of Parliament, for establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland; and to revive and continue jo much of Two Acts, made in the Teath and Sixteenth Years of His present Majesty's Reign, as relates to regulating the Fees of the Officers of the Customs, and of the Naval Officers, in the British Colonies in America, and of the Officers of the Cuffons in the Island of New-

foundland.

An Ast to enable His Majesty to establish a Court of Criminal Judicature in Norfolk Island.

An Act for taking of Special Bail in Actions and Suits depending in the Court of Common Pleas of the County Palatine of Lancaster. An Act for building a new Shire Hall for the

County of Stafford.
