The Lords of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council.

TIS Majesty having been pleased to appoint John Earl of Galloway to be Lord Lieutenant of the Shire of Wigtoun in North Britain, his Lordship this Day took and subscribed the Oaths of Allegiance and Abjuration, and also subscribed the Assurance, conformably to what is required by an Act passed in the First Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the First.

St. James's, May 28.

A Chapter of the Most Noble Order of the Garter having been summoned to meet this Day, the Knights Companions, in their Mantles and Collars, with the Officers of the Order, hereafter mentioned, in their Mantles, Chains and Badges, attended the Sovereign in his own Apartment; and being called over by Garter, a Procession was made from thence to the Great Council Chamber, in the following Order:

Marquis of Stafford.

THE SOVEREIGN.

The Sovereign and Knights Companions being feated, the Chancellor fignified to the Chapter the Sovereign's Pleasure for filling up the vacant Stall in the Royal Chapel at Windsor, and the Knights Companions proceeded to the Election. The Suffrages being collected by the Chancellor, and presented to the Sovereign, Henry Duke of Buccleugh (late Knight of the Thistle) was, by His Majesty's Command, declared duly elected. His Grace was, thereupon,

Two junior Knights, and conducted between them to the Sovereign, preceded by Garter (bearing the Ensigns of the Order on a Cushion) and Black Rod.

Garter presenting the Garter to the Sovereign, His Majesty delivered to the Two senior Knights, who buckled it on his Grace's Left Leg; the Chancellor pronouncing the Admonition.

Garter then presented the Ribbon, with the George, to the Sovereign; and, his Grace kneeling, the Sovereign, with the Allifance of the Two is for Knights, put it over his Shoulder; the Chancellor, in the mean Time, pronouncing the Admonition; and his Grace having kissed His Majesty's Hand,

and feverally faluted the Knights prefent, withdrew.

Garter then calling over the Knights, a Proceffion was made back to His Majesty's Apartment in the Order as before.

St. James's, May 30:

THIS Day the King was pleased to invest the Right Honorable John Earl Poulett with the Enfigns of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle.

His Majesty having figned the several Instruments for that Purpose, which were presented to the Sovereign by Matthew Robert Arnott, Esq; Gentleman Usher of the Green Rod, (in Absence of the Sourcetary,) the Earl was then called into the Royal Pre-fence, being preceded by His Royal Highness the Duke of Clarence, One of the Knights Companions of the Order, and supported on each Side by the Duke of Roxburgh and the Earl of Galloway, the Two senior Knights present, Vere Warner, Esq; One of His Majesty's Gentlemen Ushers, (in Place of the Usher of the Green Rod) carrying the Sword of State. At the Entrance a low Reverence was made, a fecond about the Middle, and, on being advanced up to the Sovereign, a third. The Earl being prefented by the Two Senior Knights, and kneeling down, the Gentleman Usher drew the Sword, and (kneeling) delivered it to the Sovereign, who thereupon knighted his Lordship. The Earl having kissed His Majesty's Hand, Green Rod administered the Oath to his Lordship. Then Green Rod, having

received the Enfigns of the Order, presented the fane (kneeling) to the Sovereign, upon a Velvet Cushion, who put the Ribband over the Earl's Left Snoulder; upon which His Lordship had again the Honor of kining His Majesty's. Hand After this the Earl role up, and, making a low Reverence, withdrew in the same Manner as he had entered.

The Ceremony was performed fron after the Levee, in His Majesty's Closet, several of the Great Officers

Then, by the Soeereign's Command, the Honorable Rear-Admiral Keith Elphinstone was introduced into the Presence between Sir George Yonge and Sir William Fawcett, the Two junior Knights Companions present, preceded by the Gentleman Usher of the Order, with Reverences as before.

The Sword of State was delivered to the Sovereign by Sir George Warren, the fecond Knight in Se-niority, and Admiral Elphinstone, kneeling, was knighted therewith. Then Lord Amherst, the senior Knight, presented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Majesty put them over the new Knight's Right Shoulder, who, being thus invested, had the Honor to kifs His Wajesty's Hand.

Sir John Borlace Warren was afterwards intro-

duced, knighted, and invested with the same Ceremonies, and having likewite kissed His Majesty's Hand, the Procession returned to the Privy Chamber in the Order above mentioned.
