And His Majeſty is pleaſed further to order and declare, and it is hereby further ordered and declared, that all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and from the ſaid Iſland of St. Lucia, and alſo to and from the ſaid Iſland of Guadaloupe, Marie Galante, and it's other Dependencies, ſubject, nevertheleſs, to the ſame Duties, Rules, Regulations Conditions, Reſtrictions, Penalties and Forfeitures to which the Trade to and from His Majeſty's Colonies, Plantations and Iſlands in the Weſt Indies is or ſhall be ſubject by Law.

And His Majeſty is further pleaſed to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all Commodities, being of the Growth, Produce or Manufacture of the ſaid Iſland of St. Lucia, and alſo of the ſaid Iſland of Guadaloupe, Marie Galante, and it's other Dependencies, ſhall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in Britiſh Ships, owned by His Majeſty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, ſubject to the ſame Duties, Rules, Regulations, Reſtrictions, Conditions, Penalties and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are ſubject to coming from His Majeſty's Colonies, Plantations or Iſlands in the Weſt Indies.

And His Majeſty is pleaſed further to order and declare, and it is hereby further ordered and declared, that nothing herein contained ſhall extend, or be conſtrued to extend, to effect or diſpenſe with any of the Proviſions contained in His Majeſty's Order in Council, bearing Date the 7th Day of this Inſtant, prohibiting the Reſort of Aliens to ſuch Parts of the Iſland of St. Domingo, as were or might be in the Poſſeſſion of His Majeſty, or to the Iſland of Martinique, or to any other Iſlands, or Parts of Iſlands, in the Weſt Indies, Part of the Dominions of His late Moſt Chriſtian Majeſty, which were or might be in the Poſſeſſion of His Majeſty during the preſent War, without Licence for that Purpoſe.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiſſioners of His Majeſty's Treafury, and the Lords Commiſſioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceſſary Directions herein, as to them may reſpectively appertain.
