

“ Denver, Fordham, Higay, Southery, Feltwell Saint Mary, Feltwell Saint Nicholas, Hockwold, Wilton, “ Methwold, Northwold, Oxburgh, Stoke Ferry, “ Wretton, Werham, West Dereham, Outwell, Upwell, and Welney, in the County of Norfolk ; “ Elm, Outwell, Upwell, Welney, Maney, Stuntney, Ely Trinity, Ely Saint Mary, Churcham otherwise Chettesham, Littleport, Strettham, Thetford, Downham, Coveney, Witchford, Witcham, “ Wingford or Wentworth, Wilburton, Haddenham, “ Mepal, Sutton, March, Doddington with Wimbington, Benwick, Chatteris, Whittlesea Saint Mary, Whittlesea Saint Andrew, and Wisbech, “ within the Isle of Ely ; and in certain Extraparochial Places adjoining or lying near to the aforesaid Parishes or Townships, or some or one of them, (which was presented to the House upon the Twelfth Day of February last ;) and also the Report which was made from the Committee to whom the said Petition was referred, might be again read :

“ And the same being read accordingly, “ Resolved, That in case it shall be thought expedient by the Petitioners, to renew their Application to this House, in the next Session of Parliament, for the specific Purposes stated in their said Petition, and no other, this House will deem General Notices of such intended Application, inserted in the London Gazette and the different County Newspapers, (as directed by the first Standing Order of the Seventh of May, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-four) and given at the different Quarter Sessions of the Peace, in the Manner therein directed, to be sufficient Notice to the Parishes, Townships or Places concerned ; and that the Maps or Plans, with the Books of Reference, which have been delivered to the several Clerks of the Peace, (in pursuance of the third Standing Order of the Seventh of June, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-two) shall be deemed sufficient, without again delivering such Maps and Books.”

“ Resolved, That all Persons concerned in Interest, who have been applied to, and have given their Consent to the Bill now depending in this House, shall be considered as consenting to such Bill as may be brought in upon the like Petition, for the Purposes mentioned in the last Resolution, and no other, unless they shall personally attend the Committee to whom such Bill may be committed, and express their Dissent, or shall give Certificates in Writing, or other Evidence of their Dissent, to be proved to the Satisfaction of such Committee.”

Now, in pursuance of the above Resolutions of the Honourable the House of Commons, Notice is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament, in the next Session, for an Act for the better Draining of the Lands lying within the several Parishes, Townships and Places mentioned or referred to in the said Resolutions, by Means of a navigable Cut or River, to branch out of the River Ouze from the common Salt Marsh, at or near a Place called Eau Brink, in the Parish of Wiggenhall Saint Mary, in the County of Norfolk, through the several Parishes of Wiggenhall Saint Mary aforesaid, South Lynn and West Lynn, in the said County of Norfolk ; and again to join the said River Ouze at or near the Harbour of King's Lynn, in the County of Norfolk aforesaid.
