

Notice is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Sessions, for obtaining an Act for widening, deepening, straightening, and enlarging the Haven extending from the Town and Port of Great Grimsby, in the County of Lincoln, to the River Humber, and which said Haven runs wholly through the Parish of Great Grimsby aforesaid; also for widening, deepening, and enlarging a certain Drain, extending from the Beck or Creek called Freshney (which divides the Parishes of Great Coates and Little Coates, in the said County of Lincoln) through or between certain Lands and Grounds lying in the several Parishes of Little Coates and Great Grimsby aforesaid, to the said Haven; and for turning into the said Drain the Water of the said Beck or Creek called Freshney, and banking or stopping up the same Beck or Creek, in order to convey from thence the said Water into the Haven aforesaid, for the Improvement and Preservation of the Navigation thereof: Or for altogether, or in Part, altering the Course and Direction, as well of the said Drain, and making one other Cut or Cuts through and across the Lands and Grounds lying in the said several Parishes of Little Coates and Great Grimsby aforesaid, or either of them; for the Purposes aforesaid; as for so altering the Course and Direction of the said Haven, and bringing the same through or across any other the Lands and Grounds, lying within the said Parish of Great Grimsby, to the River Humber aforesaid; and for erecting Locks, Sluices, and Staunches, and making Haling Paths.

Ouze Navigation.

Notice is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next Session, for an Act for altering the Course of Part of the River Ouze, in the County of Norfolk, by making a navigable Cut or new River to branch out of the old River, from a certain Place called the Common Salt Marth, at or near Eau Brink, in the Parish of Wiggenhall Saint Mary, in the said County of Norfolk, through certain Lands and Grounds in the said Parish, and in the Parishes of South Lynn, All Saints, and West Lynn St. Peter's, in the said County of Norfolk, and again to join the old River at or near the Harbour of King's Lynn, in the same County, and for embanking, inclosing, and selling the Bed, Ground, or Soil of so much of the old River as lies between the Places where the said Cut or new River will branch out of and again join therewith as aforesaid, lying in the several Parishes of Wiggenhall Saint Mary aforesaid, Islington, Tilney All Saints, Cienchwarton, West Lynn St. Peter's, and South Lynn All Saints, in the said County, and for applying the Money arising therefrom towards the Purposes of the Act; and also for erecting a Bridge over the said intended Cut or new River, in the Parishes of Wiggenhall St. Mary and West Lynn Saint Peter's aforesaid, or one of them, at the Old Sea Bank or common Road, called the North Sea Bank, which divides or runs between the said Two Parishes of Wiggenhall Saint Mary and West Lynn St. Peter's, and for making proper Avenues and Roads to and from the said Bridge, that is to say, from the Turnpike Road (leading from King's Lynn aforesaid to Wisbech, in the Isle of Ely) along the said North Sea Bank to the East End of the said Bridge, and from the West End of the said Bridge along the said North Sea Bank to the East Bank of the River

Ouze, and from thence across the Salt Marth belonging to William Lee Antonio, Esquire, and across the present Channel and Sands in the Parishes of Wiggenhall Saint Mary and Islington aforesaid, to join the present River Bank on the West Side of the Channel at a certain Place called Church-Green, in the Parish of Islington aforesaid; and also a Road in the Parishes of Wiggenhall Saint Mary, and Wiggenhall Saint German, from the Head or upper End of the said new River or Cut, along the West Side of the present River Bank, over the Lands of Edward Maxwell Browne, Esquire, to join a Road at a House in the Occupation of — Bentley, in the Parish of Wiggenhall Saint German aforesaid, and from thence to the said Turnpike Road; and also for improving the Navigation and Channel of the said River, from the North End of the said Cut or new River, through the said Harbour of King's Lynn, and the several Parishes of South Lynn All Saints, West Lynn Saint Peter's, North Lynn, Terrington Saint Clement, Saint Margaret's in King's Lynn, Gaywood, South Wootton, and North Wootton; all in the said County of Norfolk; and also for making and erecting Ebb Doors at Denver, Old Bedford, and Salter's Load Sluices, in the Parish of Denver, in the said County of Norfolk; and for erecting such Staunches, Locks, Pen Sluices, Jetties, or other Works in the several Navigations or Rivers following, as may be found necessary to prevent any Injury to the Navigation of the said Rivers, or any of them, by making the said Cut or new River from Eau Brink to King's Lynn aforesaid, that is to say, in the River Ouze, Grant or Cam, running from the said Place called Eau Brink to the Town of Cambridge, in the County of Cambridge, in, to, or through the several Parishes or Townships of Wiggenhall Saint Mary, Wiggenhall Saint German, Wiggenhall Saint Peter, Wiggenhall Saint Mary Magdalen, Watlington, Holme, Thorpland, Stow Bardolph, Wimbotham, Downham Market, Denver, Fordham, Hilgay, and Southery, in the County of Norfolk; Littleport, Ely Trinity, Ely Saint Mary, Thetford, and Stretham, within the Isle of Ely; Barway, Soham, Wickin, Burwell, Reach, Swaffham Prior, Swaffham Bulbeck, Bottisham, Waterbeach, Horningfey, Ditton, Milton, Chesterton, Barnwell, and Cambridge, in the County of Cambridge; in the River called the New Bedford or Hundred Foot, running from a Place called Denver Sluice, in the Parish of Denver, in the said County of Norfolk, to the Parish of Earith, in the County of Huntingdon; and the River Ouze running from the said Parish of Earith to the Town of Bedford, in the County of Bedford, in, to, or through the several Parishes or Townships of Denner, Hilgay, Upwell, and Welney, in the County of Norfolk; Welney, Littleport, Downham, Coveney, Ely, Witchford, Witcham, Wingford or Wentworth, Mepal, Sutton, and Haddenham, within the Isle of Ely; Willingham, Over, Swacey, and Fen Drayton, in the County of Cambridge; Bluntisham with Earith, Hollywell with Needingworth, Fenstanton, Saint Ives's, Hemingford Greys, Houghton cum Winton, Hemingford Abbots, Godmanchester, Harford, Huntingdon, Brampton, Buckden, Sturtloe, Orford Cluney, Orford Darcy, Diddington, Southo, Little Paxton, Great Paxton, Saint Neor's, and Eynebury, in the County of Huntingdon; Eaton with Eaton Ford, Wyboiston, and Crois Hall, Little Barford, Roxton with Chaufon, Tempsford, Great
