

Navy-Office, October 24, 1794.

N. B. The said William Hunter, until very lately, resided in Beaufort-Buildings, Strand, is about Twenty-five Years of Age, Five Feet Six Inches high, light Complexion, wears his own Hair tied behind, and has lost a Leg.

WHEREAS by an Act of the last Session of Parliament, Cap. 32, the Legislature has thought it expedient to give Relief to such Persons as may be the bona fide Holders of Bills of Exchange, Promissory or other Notes, Drafts, or Orders, written by the Drawers, with Intent to defraud or impose, upon Paper not stamped, or if stamped, not of the proper Denomination or Value, whereby the Holders of these Securities are prevented from recovering their just Demands, by reason that the same, not being stamped in pursuance of the Act of the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty, Cap. 25, cannot be given in Evidence in any of His Majesty's Courts: Notice is hereby given to the Holders of the Bills, Notes, Drafts, or Orders abovementioned, on the 1st Day of January, 1794, that, upon producing the same to His Majesty's Commissioners of the Stamp Duties at any Time, during Office Hours, before the 1st Day of January, 1795, and then fully answering, UPON OATH OR SOLEMN AFFIRMATION, all lawful Questions relating to such Securities, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners, they will direct their Officers, upon Payment of the proper Duty, and the Sum of Ten Pounds over and above the said Duty, for each, to stamp the same.

SOUTHWARK STREET TOLLS.

Notice is hereby given, that the Commissioners for putting in Execution an Act of Parliament passed in the Sixth Year of His Majesty King George the Third, for paving the Streets and Lanes, within the Town and Borough of Southwark, and certain Parts adjacent, in the County of Surrey; and for cleansing, lighting and watching the same; and also the Courts, Yards, Alleys, and Passages adjoining thereto, and for preventing Annuances therein, will meet at Union-Hall, in Union-Street, Southwark, on Thursday the 27th of November next, at Eleven of the Clock in the Forenoon, to let, by Auction, upon a Lease for Three Years from the 1st Day of January next, the Sunday Tolls of the Southwark Pavements; arising and payable at the Toll-Gates, at the Arms-Houses in St. George's Fields, near Doved-End; at Newington-Causeway; at the End of Kent-Street; at the End of Long-Lane; and at the

New-Road between Dockhead and the Folly-Bridge, in the Manner directed by the Act of Parliament passed in the Thirteenth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to explain, amend and reduce into one Act of Parliament, the general Laws now in Being for regulating the Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England, and for other Purposes; which Tolls produced the last Year 515 l. over and above the Expence of collecting, and will again be put up at that Sum: And whoever happens to be the best Bidder, must, at the Time of letting, make a Deposit of 10 per Cent. of the annual Sum agreed upon: And at the Time of executing the Lease, to make up that Deposit one Quarter's Rent, which is always to be paid in Advance; and give Security, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners, for the Performance of his Part of the Lease.
