down this way, which we here the more concern our selves at, because the 50000 Crowns which we promifed the Sieur Calvo, in lieu of tertain Contribu-tions and Quarters, are not yet paid. From the Khine we hear that the French are laying a Bridge over that River, that they have put 10 Companies of Foot into Muis, and that the Sieur Calvo has offered the City of Cologne a Neutrality, but upon fuch conditions, as those Magistrates will never confent to.

Amsterdam, Fan. 20. Some Gentlemen that came hither this morning from Nimeguen, seem very confident, that the Peace between the Emperor and France, will be concluded before the end of this Month, for that the main difficulties that might have hindred it, were taken out of the way: They add, that it's very probable the Peace between the Emperor and Sueden may be concluded at

the fame time.

Hague, Fan. 20. Oreat complaints being daily brought to the States by the Merchants of these Countries, that their Ships, under divers pretences, 'are taken and seized as well by the Suedes as Danes Men of War, they have refolved to write to those two kings, to demand reparation for the injuries their Subjects have received, and to let them know, that if that be denied them, they shall be forced to right them themselves. The Deputies of the State are returned to Frizeland, with orders to remain at Leeinserden till the States of that Province affemble, for that the matter, which is at present contested by that Province, against the sence of the generality, appears to be of that importance, that it is by no means to be left undetermined, and therefore the States General are extream zealous in the thing. Two days fince arrived here an Express from France, with Letters to the States from their Ambassadors at that Court, upon which an Express was likewise sent to the Prince of Otange, who we told you in our last, was gone for Gelderland. Here is arrived the Heer Meynders, from the Elector of Brandenburg, he has not had any publick Audience of the State, but only conferences with the Ministers. The 17th instant the French Amballador Monfigur d' Avaux, and the Sieur Mayerkroon Envoy Extraordinary of the King of Denmark, had a long conference together at the House of the Marquis de Monponillan, which has given occasion to believe that the peace of the North is not far off.

Ditto. The Letters we received yesterday from Flanders brought us the welcome News, that Aeth was Evacuated the 17th instant and delivered up to the Baron de Feu, by the Marquis de Nancre who marched out at the head of the Garison; they add, that the Duke de Villa Hermofa had received Bills of Exchange for a very confiderable fum of Money from Spain, and that the English Troops had received orders to return home. The Negotiation between the Imperialists and French at Nimequen has advanced very little since our last, for as we then told you, the Imperialists had agreed to the Articles concerning the Emperors not affiffing the Northern Aujes, and the French retaining several places in the Country of Liege, &c. till the Peace of the North be made, in return of which they expected some moderation in the conditions which concern the Duke of Lorrdin, but the French have answered that their orders are positive in the point and that they cannot recede from one tittle that is Infifted on by them with relation to that Duke.
