

Victualling-Office, March 10, 1795.

**T**HE Honorable House of Commons having, on the 9th Instant,

RESOLVED,

“ That all Persons interested in or entitled unto any Bills payable in Course of the Navy or Victualling Offices, which were made out on or before the 30th Day of September, 1793, who shall, on or before the 1st Day of May, 1795, carry the same (after having had the Interest due thereupon computed and marked upon the said Bills at the Navy or Victualling Offices respectively, to the 10th Day of March, 1795) to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, to be marked or certified by him or his Paymaster and Cashier to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, shall be entitled, in respect of the same, to 108*l.* Capital Stock for every 100*l.* contained in such Certificates, and so in Proportion for any greater or lesser Sum; such Capital Stock to be attended with Annuities, at the Rate of 5*l.* per Centum per Annum, to commence from the 5th Day of January, 1795, to be payable half-yearly, in lieu of all other Interest; the said Annuities to be added to and made one joint Stock with, and to be redeemable at the same Time and in like Manner as the Annuities established by the Acts of the Twenty-fourth, Twenty-fifth and Thirty-fourth Years of His present Majesty's Reign, for granting Annuities to satisfy Navy, Victualling and Transport Bills and Ordnance Debentures; and that the said Annuities shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Fund.”
