And the Gentlemen Pensioners and Yeomen of the Guard are to take Care that no Person be suffered to stand in their respective Rooms, so as to obstruct the Procession.

And, to prevent the Inconveniencies which have arisen from the Space before Their Majesties, which is allotted for Minuet Dancing, being exceedingly crowded, it is requested that those Ladies only who mean to dance will send for Dancers Tickets, and sit in those Places, as the Seats have been found too few to accommodate the Dancers.

No Persons in Mourning will be admitted to St. James's on the above Gala Days.

By HIS MAJESTY'S Command,  
**O**RDERED, That no Coaches (those of the Royal Family excepted) be admitted into any of the Courts of His Majesty's Palace at St. James's on the Night of the Nuptials of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, or on the Day of the Drawing-Room ensuing.

And that all Chairs do come in at the Gate in Cleveland-Row, from whence they are to proceed through the Green Cloth Court to the Bar at the Passage leading to the Great Court, where they are to set down, and return through the Piazza under the Ball-Room into the other Courts, where they are to attend, being placed in Order.

The Footmen attending Chairs are to wait in the Green Cloth Court, ranging themselves on each Side the Broad Pavement, so as to leave Room for the Chairs to pass.

His Majesty's Serjeant Porter, Yeoman and Groom Porters, and Marshal-Men, are strictly required to put these Orders in Execution, and to take into their Custody all Persons who shall offend against the same, or behave in an indecent or riotous Manner. Such Offenders will be proceeded against in the most exemplary Manner.

It is farther ordered, That the Serjeant Porter, Yeoman and Groom Porters, and Marshal-Men, do

that all the Gates and Avenues to the Palace, upon the first Notice that the Procession is coming from the Apartments to the Chapel, and that they take particular Care that no Servants come within any of the Bars.
