IN pursuance of Notice given the 9th of July last, this Corporation have caused a Vessel fitted for a Floating Light to be placed near the Goodwin Sands, about One Mile North East from the North Sand Head, between the North and South Forelands; on which Vessel Three distinct Lights are now exhibited (to distinguish them from the North and South Foreland Lights) and which will be constantly attending and kept burning from Sun-setting to Sun-rising, for the Benefit of Navigation: A large Bell is also fixed on Board, which will be rung in hazy or thick Weather, to warn Ships of the Danger as they approach the said Sand, when the the Lights may not be seen.
