ever, which shall not wholly have accrued within the, preceding Quarter of a Year, or which shall not be presented as aforesaid, and within the Time limited as aforesaid, are not, under any Pretence or Colour of Authority whatever, to be paid, fatisfied, or discharged, nor any Part thereof, but are barred both at Law and in Equity; and all Bonds, Bills, Neces, or other Securities for Money, given or made in Confideration of any Debt or Demand, whereof the Particulars in Writing are not delivered as aforefaid, are, to all Intents and Purposes, null and void.

As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their Several Callings, centrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the follow-Ing Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or infrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manafacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments, used by them, as well as to the Artistcers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5. George I. Chap. 27.

F any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Ison, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seifions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUND'S for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Montes, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon saying been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and impritoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artifeers, shall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any inch Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm with n Six Months after Warning given by the Ambasiacor, Minister or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Persons

shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Uie, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His

Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Jultice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majetty's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid, such justice may send his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions : And, if such Person shall resuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall. oe delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpose aforesaid, he shall give such Security to the King not to depart out of His Majetty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of reat Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in treland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or seduced, for seit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Impriforment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again ofiending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Ferson in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some
