extend to all Ships and Velfels whatfoever, laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of Great Britain with Salted Provisions of any Kind whatfoever, or with Batter, Cherfe, Hay, Straw or Porage of any Kind whatfoever, and which Ships or Velfels shall be employed in carrying any of the Articles abovementioned to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefly in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 6th of May laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Aih or Pearl-Aih (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the 7th Day of this inflant November ; And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Períon or Períons whatfoever do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the 7th Day of this instant November, export, or sttempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Afh or Pearl-Afh, withdut Leave or Permiffion being fift had and obtained from His Majefly or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by 20 A& paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majefly's Reign, intituled, @ An Act for indemnifying all Perfors ** who have been concerned in adviging or carrying " into Execution an Order of the Lords Commif-" fioners of His Majefty's Treafury respecting the ** Exportation of Pot-Afhes or Pearl-Afhes; Int " preventing Suits in coolequence of the lame ; " for authorizing His Majelly to probibit the Ex-" portation or carrying Coaffwile of Pot-Alhes or " Pearl-Aftics, and for making further Provisions " relative thereto." But it is neverthelefs His Majelty's Pleafare, that nothing herein contained thall extend, or be confirmed to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Illands of Guerniey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plancations in America or the West Indice, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majelly's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the filand of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the Eaff Indies ; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Izeland, or to His Majefty's Mands of Gueraley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefly's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Well Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majelty's Forts and Scitlements. on the Coaft of Africa, or to the liland of St. Helene, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Deflination of the fame to the Places for which they fliall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame thall be made, and do give fall and fafficient Security, by Bood, to the Satisfaction of the Committioners of His Majetty's Cultorns, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fugh Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiflioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Committioners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificater, in fuch Form and Manner as fhall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, thewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britsin, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refrectively appertain.

X7HEREAS His Majefty was graciously pleafed, by HisRoyal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1797, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Scamon, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefly's Service, fhould be paid in the Mander thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for railing Mon for the Service
