And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasfury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are are to give the necessfary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. TEEREAS the Time limited by His Majefly's Order in Council of the 6th of May laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Aft or Pearl-Afth (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the 7th Day of this inftant November : And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefly doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the 7th Day of this inftant November, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Afh or Pearl-Afh, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majefly or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majefly's Reign, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all Perfons " who have bee concerned in adviling or carrying . into Execution an Order of the Lords Commif-" fioners of His Majefty's Treasury respecting the " Exportation of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for As preventing Suits in confequence of the fame; " for authorizing His Majefly to prohibit the Exe portation or carrying Coastwife of Pot-Ashes or " Pearl-Afhes, and for making further Provisions " relative thereto." But it is neverthelefs His Majesty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirued to extend; to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majeity's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to New-

on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in that East Indies ; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefly's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Deflination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places. for which they are fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as fhall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Arti-, cles have been duly landed at the Places for which, they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cirque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.
