

Whitehall, November 20, 1795.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that late on the Night of Thursday the 12th Instant, or early in the Morning of Friday the 13th Instant, Two Guns, loaded with Slugs or other Pieces of Lead, were, by certain evil-minded Persons, fired into a Bedchamber of the Dwelling-House of — Pyrke, Esq; a Magistrate for the County of Gloucester, situate at Littleton in the said County, with Intent him the said Mr. Pyrke to murder and kill; which said Slugs or other Pieces of Lead passed close to a Bed which was in the said Chamber, and in which the said Mr. Pyrke used to sleep.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above daring and cruel Act of Violence and Outrage, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more the said Offenders, (except the Person or Persons who actually so fired the said Two Guns or either of them) who shall discover his or their Accomplices or Accessories, so that any one or more of them may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, His Majesty does hereby promise a Reward of **ONE HUNDRED POUNDS** to any Person or Persons (except as before excepted) who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any one or more of the said Offenders; to be paid by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury upon Conviction.
