THE following Addresses having been transmitted to his Grace the Duke of Portland, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, have been by him presented to the King; which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Aux Etats de l'Isle de Jersey, l'An Mil sept cent nonante cinq, le neuvième Jour de Novembre. Les Etats aujourd'hui assemblés, pour le première Fois, depuis que la facheuse Nouvelle est arrivée du Darger auquel leur debonnaire Souverain a été exposée, par l'Attentat de quelques Méchans sur sa Personne sacrée, employent le premier Moment de leur Scéance pour témoigner, par une humble Adresse à Sa Majesté, l'Horreur et l'Indignation que leur inspire cet énorme Crime: Ils assurent Sa Majesté que la Loyauté, toujours inébranlable de ses fidèles Sujets de cette Isle, est augmentée, s'il est possible, à l'Occasion présente: Que leur Attachement pour la Personne de Sa Majesté et son illustre Famille en est redoublé. Ils se représentent, avec la plus vive Reconnoissance tous les Bienfaits et la Protection dont ils jouissent sous sons heureux Regne, et ils unissent leurs Coeurs et leurs Voix pour invoquer, avec Reerveur, le Toutpuissant de conserver Sa Majesté, et la combler de ses plus précieuses Graces.
