ESCAPE.

WHEREAS Richard Lee, late of the Strand, in the County of Middlesex, Bookseller, stands indicted for publishing a traitorous and seditious Libel intitled "King Killing," and also for publishing Two other traitorous and seditious Libels, and being apprehended and conveyed, by Lord Chief Justice Kenyon's Tipstaff, to the House of Thomas Wright, One of the Officers of the Sheriff of Middlesex, for safe Custody until he should find Sureties to answer the said Indictments or be committed to Prison, escaped out of such Custody on the Evening of Wednesday the 9th Day of this Instant December: The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in order that the said Richard Lee may be brought to Justice for the Offences whereof he is indicted, are hereby pleased to offer a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person who shall discover the said Richard Lee, so that he may be taken and committed, and dealt with according to Law. The said Richard Lee is a very young Man, of a boyish Appearance, about Five Feet Seven Inches high, wears his own Hair in his Neck, is of a pale Complexion, thin Visage, and very slender.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the Night of the 29th, or early in the Morning of the 30th ultimo, a barbarous and inhuman Murder was committed on the Body of Thomas Newell, a private Soldier in the North York Regiment of Militia, near the Barracks, at Tynemouth, in the County of Northumberland, and that all Endeavours to discover the Person or Persons who committed the said Murder, have hitherto proved ineffectual.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the inhuman Murder above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually committed the said Murder) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

Whitehall, November 24, 1795.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the Afternoon of Saturday the 7th Instant, as John Sykes, a Soldier in the 3d Battalion of the 1st Regiment of Foot Guards, was passing through Thames-

Street in the City of London, to his Quarters in the Tower, he was, without any Provocation on his Part, violently assaulted by Three Men, who were unknown to him, and stabbed in his Right Leg, and cut across the Calf thereof with some sharp Instrument, of which said Stab and Cut he now lies dangerously maimed and wounded; and that upon his endeavouring to seize the Man by whom he believed he was so wounded and cut, the others again assaulted him, and rescued the Person whom he had so seized.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above daring and cruel Act of Violence and Outrage, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the said Offenders, (except the Person who actually gave the said Stab and Cut,) who shall discover his or their Accomplices, so that any one or more of them may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
