AT the Court at St. James's, the 13th of Jauary,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that the malignant and epidemic Fever, of the Nature of the Plague, which fome Time fince prevailed in the City of New York, and in the Town of Norfolk in Virginia, within the United States of America, has fubfided, and that Health is perfectly restored to the faid City of New York, and to the faid Town of Norfolk; and that the Communication between those Places and the City of Philadelphia is again opened; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, and being defirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confiftent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Order in Couneil bearing Date the 14th Day of October, 1795, upon all Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods and Merchandize arriving from the City of New York, and the Town of Norfolk in Virginia, in the United States of America, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their refpective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in cafe fuch Order of the 14th Day of October, 1795, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the

contrary notwithstanding; provided that the Masters or other Persons having Charge of such Ships or Vessels respectively, do first make Oath before the Custom-House Officer or Chief Magistrate at the Places respectively, at which such respective Ships or Vessels have arrived, or shall arrive, that their Crews are free from all Infection: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHERE AS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twentysecond of July last, prohibiting the transporting into
any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, BarIron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits,
Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other
Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-sisth Day
of this instant January: And whereas it is judged
expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the

Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition ! should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty-fifth Day of this instant January, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to ena-" ble His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-" portation of Salt-Petre, Arms and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council." But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa; or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purposes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in Ametica or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered

Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes specified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefly's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein; as to them may respectively appertain.
