

Whitehall, February 29, 1796.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, on or about the 22d of February instant, divers wicked Letters were sent to sundry Gentlemen, Farmers, and others of the Town and the adjacent Country of Ely, as well as thrown into the Gardens of the same, containing Threats to lay waste and destroy the Barns and Stacks of Corn belonging to them: His Majesty, for the better Detection of the Person or Persons concerned in the writing, sending and throwing the said Letters into the said Gardens, is hereby pleased to offer his most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person or Persons who actually wrote, sent or threw the same) who shall discover his, her or their Accomplice therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
