AT the Court at St. James's, the 23d of March,

ESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. KEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirtythird Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing Regulations re-" fpecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or refident therein, in certain Cases," and which Act hath been continued, by subsequent Acts of Parliament, it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That when and so often as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall think it necessary for the Safety and Tranquillity of the Kingdom, by His or Their Proclamation or Order in Council, to direct that Aliens of any Description in the said Proclamation or Order contained (not being Alien Merchants, within the true Intent and Meaning of the faid Act) shall not be landed in this Kingdom, except at fuch Places, and under fuch Regulations, as shall be in such Proclamation or Order expressed; then, and in every fuch Cafe, the Master or Commander of every Ship or Veffel or Boat, having any fuch Alien or Aliens on Board, shall not suffer any fuch Alien or Aliens to land within any Part of this Kingdom, contrary to fuch Proclamation or Order in Council, unless by the express Permission of His Majefty, fignified under the Hand of One of His Majesty's Principal Secretariss of State; and every fuch Master or Commander, wilfully neglect-

lations contained in fuch Proclamation or Order shall forfeit FIFTY POUNDS for every Alien fo landed, to be recovered as therein mentioned; and fuch Ship or Veffel from on Board of which any fuch Alien or Aliens shall so land, and every other Vestel or Boat used in landing such Alien or Aliens, shall and may be seized by any Officer or Officers of the Cuttoms or Excise, and the fame shall respectively be forfeited, together with all Tackle, Apparel, Ammunition and Furniture thereunto respectively belonging: His Majesty, for the Safety and Tranquillity of this Kingdom, hath thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is by His Majesty, by and with fuch Advice, and under the Authority of the faid Acts of Parliament, hereby accordingly ordered, That from and after the Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, no Alien or Aliens on Board of any Ship or Veffel or Boat, coming or arriving directly or immediately from any Port or Place in France, or any Port or Place under the Dominion of the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government in France, or from any Port or Place of or in, or belonging to any Country or Territory at War with Great Britain, shall (until His Majesty's Royal Pleasure concerning such Aliens shall be further expressed) be landed, or be suffered by the Master or Commander of any such Ship, Veffel or Boat to land, at any Port or Place within this Kingdom, except at the Ports of Yarmouth, Haring to conform to any of the Directions or Regu- | wich, Dover and Southampton, and at Gravefend,
