to attack the Territorics of the Elector of Brandenburg.

Eruges, March 11. Courtray was furrendred to the Spaniards on the 7th initant; and this day his Excellency the Duke de Villa Hermofa arrived at Ghent, where great preparations have been made for his reception. It is not certain whether his Excell: ney will come hither or not.

Brussels, March 10. On Tuefday the French quitted Courtray, and the Marquis de Wargny, took poffeffion of it with the Spanish Troops, The fame evening the Count d'Avergne, Colonel General of the French Infantry arrived here with a numerous Train, and parted again yesterday for Bergen-op-zoum, to take polloll.on of that Marquilate to which he is reffored by the Peace. The States of this Province have at length undertaken the payment of their Quota of the Arrears of Contributions due to France; which the States of Guelderland and Luxemburg cannot yet be brought to do, though his Excellency has very carnelly prefied it. Yelterday the chief Prefident with fome other of the principal Miniflers of this Court, went to Ghent, to inform themselves of the flate of things there. In the mean time those Inhabitants make great preparations for his Excellency's reception there, which will be to morrow; his Excellency will part hence this afternoon, intending to lodge this night at Dendermond.

Bruffels, March 14-His Excellency is now at Ghent, and will flay there till the end of the next week, or the beginning of the following, being refolved to fettle the affairs of Flanders before his return; those of the Council of Flanders, who remained at Ghent under the French Government, are continued in their places, upon payment of 130 thouland Gilders to his Excellency. The Letters we receive from Holland fay, that there is not any appearance that the States will give up Maestricht to this Crown, which we here promifed our k lves they would do, purfuant to what was flipulated in the late Treaty of Alliance with them. Our Spanish Ordinary arrived the last night, the Letters it brings give us among other things an account, that they had advice from Portugal, that the Marquis d'Aronches had began his journy by land for England, whither he is fent by the Prince Regent in quality of his Ambaffador Extraordinary, his Train being gone before by Sca. From Cologne they write, that the French are proparing to paisthe Rhine.

Faris, March 15. The Dutch Ambalfadors will finally make their publick entry on Sunday next, the difficulty which hath to long hindred it being removed by the States leaving it wholly to the King to regulate the honors and respects to be shewed to their Amballadors on that occasion. Monsieur de la Reynie having been particularly employed to examine certain perfons acculed of Poylonings, hath difcovered a great many others, who are fufpected to be guilty; and there are between 30 and 40 that be now priloners at the Bastile and at Bou de Vincenmes for the fame; they will be brought to a speedy Tryal, the King having appointed Commissioners who are to give Judgment without any Appeal. The day on which the King will begin his progrefs, is fixed, as we are told, for the 10th of May. From Liege we have an account, that Monfieur Calvo had not yet paffed the *Rhine*, as had been reported. but that in all probability he would very fuddenly. Courtray is furrendred to the Spaniards; and the Mareschald' Humieres has leave to come hither. The Gall be well sewarded.

Martiage of the King of Spain with Madamoifelle is fpoken of as a thing molt certain, and that it will be declared upon the arrival of the Marquis de las Baibaces, who comes hither in quality of Ambaffador Extraordinary from that King.

Falmouth, March 3: The wind continuing for these 3 or 4 days past at E. and S. E. about 40 Sail of English Merchantmen from *Bourdeaux*, and other Ports in France, have put in here, being bound for foreign Ports. Twelve Dutch Merchantmen are likewife arrived here, being bound home from France; and yesterday came into this Port eight Sail more of Dutch Ships, under the Convoy of a Man of War of 30 Guns, from Bilboa.

Plimouth, March 4. Yesterday the Sweepflakes, with another of His Majestics Frigats, came into this Bay, with a Fleet of Merchantmen bound for feveral Ports in the Mediterranean under their Convoy, to call for fuch thips as were here bound that way; and the laft night they all fet fail again.

Portsmouth, March 4. Here is arrived the Dover of Chefter, from Haure de Grace, from whence fhe came the 22 paft; the Mafter reports, that they are fitting out there ten Men of War, which are to carry 40 and 50 Guns each, and that befides, they are equipping fix Merchantmen for the Kings fervice, which are to be mounted with between 30 and 40 Guns apiece, which were almost ready to fail when he came from thence. The Master adds, that there came out from Havre de Grace at the fame time with him three Flyboats, laden with Soldiers, Ammunition, and Scamen, bound for Breff.
