A^T the Court at St. James's, the 1st of June, 1796,

P R E S E N T, The KING's Moft Excellent Majetty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 2d of December latt, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of this inflant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter-General of the Ordnance for His Majelty's Service) do, at any T'me during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this inftant June, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or fhip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, apon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refpective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in

the Twenty ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reigra intituled, " An Act to impower His Majefty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition ; and alfo to empower His " Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of Sait-" Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am-" munition :" - And the Right Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majetty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for execuing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General of the Ordnance, and His Majefly's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.
