Admiralty-Office, June 21, 1796. Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Kingfmill to Mr. Nepean, dated L'Engageante, Cork Harbour, June 15, 1796.

MY Letter of the 13th Instant acquainted you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that I had fent out La Trompeufe Sloop to meet the Unicorn and her Prize La Tribune, and afford them any Affiitance they might nced; you will now pleafe to communicate to their Lordships, that, in Execution of these Orders, La Trompeule, within a few Hours after failing from hence, on the 12th Inftant, difcovered Two Brigs, the nearest of which, a Collier, having but just before been captured by the other, was immediately re-taken, and Captain Watfon proceeded in Chace of the Privateer, which he had the good Fortune to come up with, and to capture about Ten o'Clock the fame Evening clofe in Shore between Bally Cotton and Cable Ifland. She proves to be L'Eveille, mounting Six Guns, Four of which were thrown overboard during the Chace, but carrying One Hun-dred Men; had been out Ten Days from Breft, and had in the Morning, well to the Southward, taken a Newfoundland outward-bound Brig, which our other Cruizers are likely to intercept.

As several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their Several Callings, contrary to the Laws of theje Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Di/obedience to them : And it will be ob erved, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of theje Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon fhall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and thall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Weftminfter, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

JRO. 13903.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, fliall go into any Country out of His Majetty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Count y where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perion authorifed by tuch Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, Devife or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any. Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavour-ing to feduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Lominions, for the Purpofes aforefaid, fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confeffion, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And, if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Juffice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majetty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reafonable, and thall be imprifoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indicament or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland'; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and thall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted. for
