#### London Docks and Canal.

Notice is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for Leave to bring in a Bill, and to obtain an Act to make and maintain a certain navigable Dock or Docks, with Wharfs thereunto attached, communicating with the River Thames, at or near the Hermitage Dock; also at or near Bell Dock in Wapping; also at or near the South End of Fox's Lane, near to Shadwell Dock, in Lower Shadwell; and also for making a certain further Communication with the aforesaid River Thames at Limehouse, to join the Bromley Cut at or near Richardson's Timber-Yard, and go into the River Thames at or near the present Entrance to the aforesaid Bromley Cut, across Narrow-Street, Limehouse. All which said Dock or Docks, Wharfs and Communications, are proposed to be situate in, or pass in, to or through the several Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, Divisions, Districts, Precincts, Liberties, Manors or Places following, (that is to say) Saint Botolph without Aldgate, in the Manor of East Smithfield, otherwise called Saint Botolph without Aldgate, East Smithfield, Saint John of Wapping, Saint George Middlesex, commonly called Saint George's in the East, Saint Paul's Shadwell, otherwise called Saint Paul's Shadwell alias Chadswell, Ratcliffe alias Radcliffe, Saint Anne Middlesex, commonly called Saint Anne Limehouse, and Saint Dunstan Stepney, alias Stebenhythe alias Subenhede, all within the Tower Division or Hamlets in the County of Middlesex.

Also for Leave to bring in a Bill, and to obtain an Act to make and maintain a certain navigable Canal, for the Navigation of Ships and other Vessels to and from the said Dock or Docks, and Communications, in the aforesaid Parishes and Places above particularly specified, to go into and communicate with the River Lea, near adjoining to a certain Dock, commonly called the Copperas Dock, and from thence to go into and communicate (by the Means and with the Provision of an Entrance Dock or Bason) with the River Thames, across a certain Place, called or known by the Name of the East Marsh, to the East of the New Brunswick Dock, at Blackwall, in the Hamlet of Poplar and Blackwall. All which navigable Canal, Entrance Bason and Communication are proposed to be situate in, or pass in, to or through the several Parishes, Townships, Hamlets, Divisions, Districts, Precincts, Liberties, Manors or Places following, (that is to say) Saint Dunstan Stepney, alias Stebenhythe alias Subenhede, Saint Anne Middlesex, commonly called Saint Anne Limehouse, Poplar, and Blackwall aforesaid, and Bromley Saint Leonard, all within the Tower Division or Hamlets, in the said County of Middlesex.—Also to make and maintain a certain

new Cut or Branch, to divert and shorten the present Channel and Navigation of the River Lea; which said new Cut or Branch is proposed to be made across the North End of a certain Foreland or Peninsula, commonly called the Reed Foreland, near the Orchard House at Blackwall aforesaid, in a Right Line with and from a certain Reach of the River Lea called the Shallows, to the North End of a certain other Reach of the said River Lea called Goodluck's Hope.—Also to make and maintain the Whole or any Part of the said River Lea, which now passes round the said Reed Foreland, as also the Foreland itself, into an Entrance Dock or Bason, to join into and communicate with the said navigable Canal near to the said Copperas Dock, and with the River Thames through the said Canal across the East Marsh aforesaid.—All which new Cut or Branch, Entrance Dock or Bason, (which is situate on the Essex Side of the Mid Channel of the River Lea) are proposed to be situate in, or pass in, to or through the Parish of West Ham in the County of Essex.
