Entraits of Letters from Vice-Admiral King smill, Commander in Chief of His Mojesty's Ships and Vessels at Cork, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated on Board His Majesty's Ship Santa Margarita, the 18th and 20th of September, 1796.

YOU will please to inform their Lordships, that L'Indemnité, a fast-sailing Brig Privatcer, out of Bourdeaux, pierced for Fourteen Guns, mounting Ten, and Sixty-eight Men, arrived here the Day before Yesterday, sent in by His Majesty's Ships Diana, Cerberus and Seahorfe.

September 20, 1796.

PLEASE to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that His Majesty's Sloop Penguin arrived here Yesterday, and brought in Le Taupe à L'Oeuil, French Privateer Brig, as will appear more particularly by the inclosed Accounts from Captain Pulling.

Penguin, Cove of Cork, September 19, 1796.

SIR. Ruifing, in consequence of your Orders, Yesterday at Four P. M. after a Chace of Ten Hours, from the Southward, I took the Brig Mary, of Liverpool, (taken off Waterford by Le Taupe à l'Geuil, French Lugger Privateer, of Eight Guns and Fortytwo Men, on the 13th Infant) when the Frenchman, finding her a fast Sailer, abandoned the Privateer, taking out the Guns, Arms, and Ammunition, and armed the Mary, (changing her Name to Le Taupe à L'Oeuil) giving up the Lugger to the English Prifoners they had on Board from their different Prizes, fince which they have been cruizing in the Channel, and had taken the Brig Liverpool, of Liverpool, from Lisbon; however, I have the Satisfaction to inform you none of her Prizes escaped the Penguin, as you will see by the List I have the Honor to inclose: The Lugger, at the Time the Enemy abandoned her, had been Eighteen Days from Brest.
