A PROCLAMATION,

For Pardoning fuch Deferters from His Majefty's Marine Forces as shall return into His Majefty's Service on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next.

GEORGE R.

7HEREAS it hath been represented unto Us, that there are at this Time feveral Deferters from Our Marine Forces, who might be induced to seturn to their Duty by an Offer of Pardon, and that fuch an Inflance of Our Clemency might have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclaclamation, and do hereby promife Our most Gracious Pardon to all Deferters from Our Marine Forces, who shall furrender themselves on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next, to the Commanding Officers of the Chatham, Portfmouth or Plymonth Divisions of Marines ; and We do hereby declare, that fuch Marines, fo furrendering themfelves as aforefaid, thall not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may have formerly belonged: And We do further declare, That Our faid Pardon shall extend to such Deferters as have been apprehended, and are now in Gaol or Regimental Cuffody, upon their Arrival under Efcort at Head Quarters. But We do hereby further declare, that any Marine Soldier who shall defert after these Our Intentions shall have been made publick, shall

not be included in the Pardon above offered, but shall, if found guilty by a Court Martial, be deemedunfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Second Day of November, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-fix, in the Thirty-feventh Year of Our Reign.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majesty has received Information, that divers unjust Seizures have been made in the Ports of Spain of the Ships and Goods of His Majefty's Subjects, and that Acts of Hoftility and unprovoked Aggreffion have been committed by the Ships of His Catholick Majefty on Ships and Veffels of His Majefty and his Subjects : His Majefty therefore, being determined to take fuch Measures as are necessary for vindicating the Honor of his Crown, and for procuring Reparation and Satisfaction for his injured Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprizals be granted against the Ships, Goods and Subjects of the King of Spain, fo that as well His Majefty's Fleet and Ships, as allo all other Ships and Veffels that shall be commissionated by Letters of Marque or General Reprifals, or otherwife.

herwife, by His Majefly's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, fhall and may lawfully feize all Ships, Veffels and Goods belonging to the King of Spain, or his Subjects, or others inhabiting within the Territories of the King of Spain, and bring the fame to Judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions; and to that End His Majefty's Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commiffion, and prefent the fame to His Majesty at this Board, authorizing the Commissioner; for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Perfon or Perfons by them empowered and appointed, to islue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprifals, to any of His Majefty's Subjects, or others whom the faid Commissioners shall deem fitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, feizing and taking the Ships, Veffels and Goods belonging to Spain, and the Vafials and Subjects of the King of Spain, or any inhabiting within his Countries, Territories or Dominions; and that fuch Powers and Claufes be inferted in the faid Commiffion as have been ufual, and are according to former Precedents. And His Majesty's faid Advo. cate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are allo forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commiffion, and prefent the fame to His Majefty at this Board, authorizing the faid Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Britain, and the Lieuterant and Judge of the faid Court, his Surrogate or Surrogates, as alfo the feveral Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon, all and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes and Reprizals of all Ships and Goods that are or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the fame; and, according to the Courfe of Admiralty and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Veffels and Goods as fhall belong to Spain, or the Vaffals and Subjects of the King of Spain, or to any others inhabiting within any of His Countries, Territories and Dominions; and that fuch Powers and Claufes be inferted in the faid Commission as have been usual and are according to former Precedents; and they are likewife to prepare and lay before His Majefty, at this Board, a Draught of fuch Inftructions as may be proper to be fent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majefty's Foreign Governments and Plantations
