Fleet or Squadron shall be composed of His Majesty's own Ships,) shall be deemed and taken to be a Flag Officer, and shall be entitled to a Part or Share of Prizes as the junior Flag Officer of fuch Fleet or Squadron. And We do hereby further Order, That in case of Cutters, Schooners, and other armed Vef-'fels commanded by Lieutenants, the Share of fuch Lieutenants shall be Three Eighth Parts of the Prize, unless tuch Lieutenants shall be under the Command of a Flag Officer or Officers; in which Cafe the Flag Officer or Officers shall have One of the faid Three Eighths, to be divided among fuch Flag Officer or Officers in the Manner herein before directed in the Cale of Captains ferving under Flag Officers: Secondly, We direct that the Share of the Mafter, or other Perfon acting as Second in Command, and the Pilot (if there happens to be One on Board) shall be One, Eighth Part, to be divided into Three equal Parts, of which Two Thirds shall go to the Master or other Perfon acting as Second in Command, and the remaining One Third to the Pilot; but if there is no Pilot, then fuch Eighth Part to go wholly to the Master or Person acting as Second in Command : That the Share of the Chirurgeon or Chirurgeon's Mate (where there is no Chirurgeon) Midshipmen, and Clerk and Steward, shall be One Eighth; that the Share of the Boatfwain's, Gunner's and Carpenter's Mates, Yeoman of the Sheets, Sailmaker, Quarter Mailer and Quarter Master's Mate, shall be One Eighth; and the Share of the Seamen, Marines, and other Perfons on Board, affifting in the Capture, fhall be Two Eighth Parts. But it is Our Intention, neverthelefs, that the above Diffribution shall only extend to fuch Captures as shall be made by any Cutter, Schooner or armed Vessel, without any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels of War being prefent or within Sight of, and adding to the Encouragement of the Captors, and Terror of the Enemy : But in cafe any of His Majetty's Ships or Veffels of War shall be prefent or in Sight, that then the Officers, Pilots, Petty Officers and Men on Board fuch Cutters and Schooners, or armed Veffels, shall share in the fame Proportion as is allowed to Perfons of the like Rank and Denomination on Board His Majefty's Ships and Vessels of War.

WHEREAS by Two Acts, One passed in the Thirty-fixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to prohibit, for a limited "Time, the making of Starch, Hair-Powder, and "Blue, from Wheat and other Articles of Food, and "for lowering the Duties on the Importation of "Starch, and of other Articles made thereof;" the other passed in this present Session of Parliament for continuing the faid Act until the 1st Day of February, 1798, it is enacted, that in case His Majesty, at any Time or Times after the passing of the faid first men-

tioned Act, fhould in his Royal Difcrection, judge it most for the Benefit and Advantage of this Kingdom to permit the making of Starch from Wheat, Barley, Rice, Grain, Potatoes, Flour, Meal, or any other Article or Thing used for the Food of Man, that then it shall be lawful to and for His Majesty, by His Royal Proclamation or Proclamations, to be iflued by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, or by Majetty's Order in Council to be published in the London Gazette, from Time to Time, to permit and fuffer all and every Perfon and Perfons, Natives and Foreigners (but not any particular Perfons) at any Time or Times after the paffing of the faid Act, to make Starch from Wheat, Barley, Rice, Potatoes, Flour, Meal, or any other Article or Thing ufed for the Food of Man: And whereas it has appeared to His Majesty that it would be for the Benefit and Advantage of this Kingdom to permit the making of Starch from any of the Articles before mentioned; His Majefty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, according to the faid Acts, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the Date hereof it shall be lawful for any Person or Persons as aforefaid to make Starch from any of the Articles before mentioned, any Thing in the faid Act to the contrary notwithstanding: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly. ## PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

"HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twentieth of July laft, prohibiting the transporting into nay Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, An-chors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon this Day: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefly'a Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date hereof, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or thip or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to ena-" ble His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Na-" val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-" portation of Salt-Petre, Arms and Ammunition, " when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council."
