

Parts of the Country, it appears that unless some Measure is immediately taken there may be Reason to apprehend a Want of a sufficient Supply of Cash to answer the Exigencies of the Publick Service; It is the unanimous Opinion of the Board, that it is indispensably necessary for the Publick Service that the Directors of the Bank of England should forbear issuing any Cash in Payment until the Sense of Parliament can be taken on that Subject, and the proper Measures adopted thereupon, for maintaining the Means of Circulation, and supporting the Publick and Commercial Credit of the Kingdom at this important Conjunction; and it is ordered that a Copy of this Minute be transmitted to the Directors of the Bank of England, and they are hereby required, on the Grounds of the Exigency of the Case, to conform thereto, until the Sense of Parliament can be taken as aforesaid.
