King's Fisher, off Oporto, January 28, 1797. SIR,

I Beg Leave to acquaint you that on the 23d Instant I fell in with Two Spanish Privateers; One of which, a Lugger, mounting One Carriage Gun, and manned with Thirty-eight Men, I captured, and drove the other on Shore between Villa Conde and Vianna; the latter was a Schooner, and, I understand from the Prisoners, mounted Twelve Carriage Guns, and was manned with between Sixty and Seventy Men: Those Vessels had, for some Time past, insested this Coast, and had captured several English Merchant Vessels.
