HIS Day the Lords being met, a Mef-fage was fent to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by Mr. Quarme, the Yeoman Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majefly's Commiffion for declaring His Royal Affent to feveral Acts agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable Houfe in the Houfe of Peres. to hear the Committee at the Commons Peers, to hear the Gommiffion read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Ma rine Forces while on Shore.

An A& for appointing Commissioners for putting in Execution an A& of this Session of Parliament, initialed, An A& for granting an Aid to His Majefty by a Land Tax to be raifed in Great Britain for the Service of ithe Year One thousand feven hundred and ninety-feven.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Navigation from the Trent to the Mersey to make a navigable Canal from and out of a certain Branch of their faid Navigation called the Caldon Canal, at or near Endon, to or near the Town of Leek in the County of Stafford; and also a Refervoir for supplying the scenaria Canals of the faid Company with Water.

An Act to enlarge the Terms and Powers of two feveral Acts of Parliament, the one made in the Twenty third Year of the Reign of His late Majelty, and the other in the Eleventh Year of His prefent Majesty, for repairing the Road from the City of York, over Skipbridge, to Boroughbridge, in the County of York.
