He Alapin, a Privateer so called, hath sent in hither a Vessel supposed by him to be prize, Laden with Brandy, but pretending to belong to Stockfolme, and bound for Hambourg.

Deal, March 17. Madrid, Febr. 26. We are here informed, that an Adice Ship in her return from New Spain, having aboard her alarge quantity of Chocolate to a very confiderable value, befides other Lading, fell into the hands of an Algier Corbyte, by whom she was made prize. We are also confidently told of the Death of the Vic:-Roy of New Spain, which, if true, speedy order will be taken for a Succession. Don fuan is by her Majesties permission arrived here internite.

The Councel upon considerations of the preparations of our Neighbours, and the present posture of Assairs, are taking the for their Frontiers to avoid surprize; and have ordered, besides the Foot raised in Italy, which are designed to be transported for Flanders, that 12000 Foot, and 2000 Horse shall speedily march, part of them to be sent into the Low-Countries, but a considerable body of them towards Cataloniz, whither some Troops of Horse are already marching. They have likewise ordered sive Millians to be returned into Flanders, for payment of the Forces there, and the structure desence of that Country: Besides which summ, they are debating of some sit method for a Tax to be raised upon the place, and are appointing Commissioners for the establishment of it.

Vienna, March z. His Inperial Majesty has put off his formerly intended journey for Presburg, for this year, upon a Remonstrance made to him by the States of Hungary, acquinting him with the difficulties they finde in tailing of moneys, for the defraying the great expenses which will be required at the Empresses Coronation, and the necessary of Convenience, that the grievances of the States, now under confideration, may be first sally examined and redressed.

Letters also from Hungary inform us, That upon the retumos the Chiaus from this Court's the Visier immediately assembled his Neighbor Bassa's, and other considerable Officers, with whom he held a Council, giving us no account of their resolution, but surther tell us, That the Visier has given out his Orders to all places under his Government to bring in considerable quantities of Provisions and Ammunicion to Belgrade; but upon what sarcher design, we yet know nor.

The Mirquess de Baden has taken his leave, and lest the Court two days since, intending for Behemia, and from thence to the Court of Saxony; before his departure, his Imperial Mijesty prelenting him with two excellent horses out of his own stable.

Monsieur Serui, a Counsellor to the Duke of Newburgh, is here arrived; and 'tis said, the Duke intends also in person for this Court, in pursuance of his pretensions in Poland, which has been already negociated in the Court of War
fan.

From Constantinople we are assured. That the Grand Visier in his Lecters to the Sultan, has given him an ample

account of his proceedings, in order to the taking in of the City of Candia: From which place, he has found much more refiftance then he could have imagined, and believes the fiege will prove a business of great difficulty.

The Sieur Daniel schneider, a Deputy from the City of Colmar, sent to the Dietat Ratisbonne, was upon his return home accused on several points by the Council, which was for some time ill resented by the Citizens; but upon a right information of his result, to submit to the Decree of the Council, they were sufficiently satisfied with their procedure against him, whom they suspect not to have well managed the interests of their City.

The Dietat Ratibonne sit closes upon the perpetual capitulation, which is not as yet perfected, though they have made a considerable progress in is. The affairs of Burgogne are also under debate with the French Ministers: They are also consulting about the moneys coyned in the Emplre, but are not come, as yet, to any resolution, of making the small pieces pass at the same rate in all places, which is a debate that hath given them much trouble.

The Baron Hoyer, the Emperors Deputy at the Diet, is fent for to give his Imperial Majesty an account of the preceedings of the Diet.

By iome Latters from Hungary we are told. That a party of Turks, belonging to the Garrison of Stulweisenburg, in ranging up and down the Countrey, fell spon a party of 40 Hussars, whom they cruelly put to the Sword, giving quarter to none of them.

sair for the Generalship, had the report proved true of the
death of Polotski, which is sufficiently consuted by the Archbithop, who by Letters lately received from him, is assured
of his health, and intentions to be present at the ensuing
Diet.

The fear of a fresh invasion from the Turks and Tarrars begins to vanish, and their hopes encrease, that the approaching Diet may resettle the Kingdom in peace and quietness.

Ten thousand of the Cossacks are certainly returned to their obedience, upon a promise made to them by his Majusty, for the detence of their Religion and Priviledges; and tis much hoped the rest will be induced to follow their example.

The N bility of that Kingdom have affured his Majesty of their readiness to sacrifice their lives in the defence of his Majesty and his Kingdom against all enemies whatsoever on condition, they may be encouraged by the maintenance of their ancient priviledges.

The truce with the Muscovites for thirteen years, is like-wife confirmed', and the 2 Weywodschaffen of Potock; and Witepski, with several other places, to be given up according to agreement.
