close alongfide of her, and even this was owing to the Privateer's being becalmed, and our carrying the Breeze up with us. On the first Broadfide she struck. She is called L'Incroyable, mounts Twenty-four Guns on her Main Deck, and had on Board Two Hundred and Twenty Men. She belonged to Bourdeaux, and failed from that Port on the 2d Initant. She fortunately had made no Capture, though reputed to be the failtest failing Vessel from France. I am informed by Captain Ballard that he had been in Chace of her from the Morning of the 11th.
