Immediately after his Arrival at St. James's His Highnels received a Visit from the Marquis of Salitbury, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household.

Their Majefties and the Royal Family fent their Compliments of Welcome to His Moft Serene Highnels upon his Arrival at St. James's; and the Right Honorable Charles Greville, Vice-Chamberlain of His Majefty's Houfehold, who carried the Compliment from His Majefty, acquainted His Moft Serene Highnefs that His Majefty had appointed the enfuing Day to receive His Highnefs, after the Levee; when His Moft Serene Highnefs waited on His Majefty, and afterwards on the Queen, and on the Royal Family, at the Times refpectively appointed.

On Thursday His Highness again received Visit from divers of the Nobility, and went to the Drawing Room to pay his Compliments to the Queen; and Yetterday His Serene Highness paid his Compliments to His Majetty at his Levee.
