

PROCLAMATION, A

For the Suppression of the Mutinous and Treasonable Proceedings of the Crews of Our Ships at the Nore.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS, upon the Representation of Our Lords Commissioners of Our Admiralty refpecting the Proceedings of the Seamen and Ma-rines on Board certain of Our Ships at the Nore, We were pleafed to command Our faid Lord Commissioners of the Admiralty to fignify to the faid Seamen and Marines Our gracious Intentions, ex-preffed in Our Royal Declaration, under Our Sign Manual, bearing Date at St. James's, the Twentyfeventh Day of May instant, in the Words following : " Whereas it has been reprefented unto Us, that, " notwithftanding the Declarations made in Our "Name, and by Our Authority, by Our Lords "Commiffioners of Our Admiralty, of Our gracious " Intentions to recommend to the Confideration of Parliament, to augment the Wages and Allow-" ances of the Seamen and Marines of Our Fleet, " which Our gracious Intentions and Declarations " have fince been carried into Effect by an Act of " Parliament; and, notwithstanding the Commu-" nication made by Our Right Trufty and Right " Well-beloved Coufin and Councillor Richard Earl " Howe, Admiral of Our Fleet, of Our gracious " Intentions towards the Seamen and Marines of "Our Fleet, for the Pardon of the Offences by " them committed, and Our Royal Proclamation " thereupon, bearing Date the Eleventh Day of " May initant; and notwithstanding the Sentiments of Duty and Gratitude with which the fame were " received by the Seamen and Marines of Our other "Squadrons, yet the Crews on Board certain of "Our. Ships at the Nore have not only fince the

tentions and Declarations been guilty of divers Acts of Mutiny and Difobedience of Orders, but have even proceeded to other Acts of the most heinous and treasonable Nature, by firing upon fome of Our Ships in order to compel them to fubmit to their Direction; have threatened " and taken Measures for stopping the Commerce of the Kingdom patting to and from the Port of London, and have, by Terror of their Force, ćc compelled Two Frigates to defift from executing a particular Service, which by Our Orders they were directed to perform : We, thinking it right " to warn all Our Seamen and Marines on Board the faid Ships of the heinous Nature of the Offences by " them committed, and of the dangerous Confequences thereof to the Spirit and Difsipline of the British Navy, and to the Welfare of their Country, as well as their own Safety, do hereby earnessly c٢ require and enjoin all Our faid Seamen and Marines, immediately on the Notification of this Our Royal Declaration, to return to the regular Discharge of their Duty, as has already been done by the Crews of Our other Squadrons and Fleets, e c ftationed at Portfmouth and Plymouth, and elfewhere: And whereas We are well affured that a great Part of the Seamen and Marines on Board " the faid Ships at the Nore abhor and deteft the Criminal Proceedings which are still perfisted in on Board the faid Ships, and are defirous to return to their Duty : Now, We being defirous to ex-" tend Our Gracious Intentions of Pardon to all fuch Seamen and Marines fo ferving on Board .... Our faid Ships at the Nore, who may have returned, or shall return, upon the Notification of this Our Royal Declaration, to the regular and " ordinary Discharge of their Duty, have authorized, and do hereby authorize and empower Our faid Lords Commiffioners of Our Admiralty, or any " " Three of them, to fignify to all fuch Seamen and " full Manifeltation of all these Our gracious In-1" Marines, who may have been guilty of any of the

... or Disobedience of Orders or Neglect of Duty, " and who have returned, or who shall, upon . Notification hereof on Board their respective " Ships, return to the regular and ordinary Dif-charge of their Duty, Our Royal Intentions to grant to all such Seamen and Marines Our most ٢, " Gracious Pardon, and to promife, in Our Name, to all fuch Seamen and Marines, who have fo se returned, or shall fo return to the regular and " ordinary Difcharge of their Duty, Our most gracious Pardon accordingly : And We do hereby .« declare, that all fuch Seamen and Marines, who shall have fo returned, or shall so return to their " Duty, and to whom the faid Lords Commissioners ... of Our Admiralty, or any Three of them, shall " fo promife Our Pardon, shall receive the same · accordingly, and fhall be difcharged and releafed " from all Profecutions, Imprifonments and Penalties " incurred by reafon of any of the Acts aforefaid, " or by reafon of any Act of Mutiny or Difubedience " of Orders, or any Breach or Neglect of Duty " previously committed by them or any of them; " hereby declaring at the fame Time, that all fuch " Seamen and Marines who shall not take the " Benefit of this Our gracious Pardon, shall from "" henceforth be confidered as liable, according to the " Nature of their Offences, to fuch Punishmennt as the " Articles of War and the Law have provided for the " fame." And whereas Our Right Trufty and Right Well-beloved Coufin and Councillor George John Earl Spencer, Our Trufty and Well-beloved Charles .George Lord Arden of Our Kingdom of Ireland, and William Young, Efquire, Rear-Admiral of the White, being Three of the Lords Commissioners of Our Admiralty, did caufe Our gracious Intentions expressed in fuch Our Declaration, to be fignified to the Crews of Our Ships at the Nore, and did require fuch Crews to return to their due Obedience accordingly : And whereas it has been reprefented to Us, that some of the Crews of Our faid Ships have been defirous of returning to their Obedience accordingly, but have been prevented from fo doing by Violence; and others of Our Ships, in the actual Difcharge of their Duty, have been fired upon, and Attempts have been made to prevent fome of Our Ships from proceeding according to the Orders of their Com-manders: And whereas fuch continue I Data manders : And whereas fuch continued Perfeverance in rebellious and treasonable Attempts against Our Crown and Dignity, after repeated Admonitions and offers of Our gracious Pardon, render it neceffary for us to call on all Our loving Subjects to be aiding and affifting in repressing the fame; We have thought fit, by the Advice of Oar Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby frictly enjoin and command all .Our Admirals, Generals, Commanders and Officers of Our Forces by Sea and Land, and all Magistrates whatfoever, and all others Our loving Subjects, that they, in their feveral Stations, do use their utmost Endeavours, according to Law, to suppress all such mutinous and treasonable Proceedings, and to use all lawful Means to bring the Perfons concerned therein, their Aiders and Abettors, to Juilice : And We do hereby itrictly enjoint and command all Our loving . Subjects whatfoever not to give any Aid, Comfort, Affiftance or Encouragement whatfoever to any Perfon or Perfons concerned in any fuch mutinous and treafonable Proceedings, as they will asswer the

if the treafonable Acts aforefaid, or of any Mutiny fame at their Peril; and alfo, to the utmost of their Power and according to Law, to prevent all other Perfons from giving any fuch Aid, Affiftance, Comfort or Encouragement.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefly's

Order in Council of the 30th of November last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon this Day: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer : His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Priyy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majelly's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date hereof, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpette, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incusting and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties, inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, ... An Act to " impower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation " of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for impowering His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation " of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for impower-"ing His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation of "Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; " and alfo to impower His Majefty to refirain the carrying Coaftwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or " any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."-And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Committioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majeftv's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 30th of November laft, prohibiting the Transportation into any Parts out

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of this Kingdom any of the Wood called Lignum ! Vitæ, will expire upon the 10th Day of this inflant June : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the taid Provibition should be continued for fome Time longer ; His Majefty dota therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons wholever do, at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid ro.h Day of this initant June, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Veilel or Boar, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majelty or His Privy Council, upon · Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majetty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for indemnifying all " Perfons who have been concerned in advising -se or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords " Commissioners of His-Majelty's Treasury respect-'" ing the Exportation of Pot-Afhes or Pearl-Afhes ; -se for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame ; "for authorizing His Majelty to prohibit the Ex-"portation or carrying Coaffwife of Pot-Afhes or " Pearl-Afhes, and for making further Provisions " relative thereto." But it is neverthelefs His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained fhall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on 'Board any of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitae which may be necessary for the Ule of the faid Ship or Vesiel during the Course of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Iflands of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Welt Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majelty's For's and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena; or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid · Wood called Lignum-Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Maejefty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Ifland of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Seitlements son the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Wood called Lignum-Vitæ do first make Gath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Se-curity, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Com-millioners of His Majefty's Cultoms, to carry the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to the Places for which it is to entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners. shewing that the faid Wood called Lignum-Vitæ has been duly landed at the Places for which it was entered Outwards .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majetty's

Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High "deniral of Great Britan", and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceflary Directions herein, as to them may resubstitutely appertain.

#### Whitehall, June 13.

As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave, from Time to Time, goninto Foreign Countries to exercise their fever 11 allings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the foll weing Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the Fisst and Second and of His prefent Majesty, for preventing Such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Perfore who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them: And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewise extension to the Serding or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Fools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

#### Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perlon shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Bras, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUND's for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Differentiation of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, fhall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercile or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers fhall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons fhall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, Devife or Purchale, and ihall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefly's Ufe, and fhall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Juftice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majetty's Dominions, for the Purpofes aforefaid, fuch Juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it fhall appear by the Cath of one Witnefs, or by Confeffion, that he was guilty

of any of the faid Offences, fuch luftice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And, if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majetty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

#### Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Geat Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminsters or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, foifeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cafe of a fubsequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in. or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he fhall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weffmintler, or in the Court of Section in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Esson, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Ma-jelly's Warehoufes; all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on

Board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the beft Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who fhall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he shall, for every such Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majelly, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, h e shall for feit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Ule of His Majesty; and the other Moiety to the Ule of the Person who shall sue for the fame.

## Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majesty.

BY thefe Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veflel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatsoever, used in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel or jron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Possefion of any such Articles, with an Intent to export the same to Foreign Parts, and all Custom house Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils ufed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.

An Act for the Relief of Perfons who have omitted or may omit inadvertently to pay certain Stamp Duties herein mentioned on Deeds ar other Inftruments, and for afcertaining the Duty payable on Hats imported into this Kingdom.
