

Whitehall, August 18, 1797.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Saturday last the 12th Instant, Mr. Robert Laing, one of the Witnesses against John Everit, who had been tried and convicted before Mr. Justice Rooke, at the Assizes for the County of Northumberland for uttering seditious Speeches, received a threatening Letter, of which the following is a Copy.

“ you Loufey Scots Son of a Bich who Came to shield as yesterday Quite Naked without Either Shoe or Stocking—your moth^r was a Thieff & Lecd. to ben hung as the People in Ireland would have Dun with you you Villian for your honest Actions in that Quart^r. however Shall Drop that Subject and make you acq^d. that your Ships B^t Bower Cable is Cutt in A grate maney Places by this Time, & we all in General hope that jⁿ Everit^s Wife or Soume for hir will Cut your Throt, the furst oportunety that shall offer is our fincear Wils^h & Prayer.—you Defining Villian you shall be meet Mr. Morpeth Gaill, all ye R—— Got Money your Master of will nor shall not protect you—you parjured Villian.
