time the Reb. Is under the command of father Jobs, had fallen upon the Emperors Gold Min.s, had taken Schemmins, and fet fire to the Town, after having plundered it. It is faid orders have been fent to the Duke of Lorrain to draw all his Troops out of their Winter-quarters, to take the Field with them, and to remain there till the Peace be executed.

Strasburg, May 5. We are now expecting that pirfuant to the Articles of the Peace the Prench will e a uate the places they are poffedfed of in Alface; We have an account that there has been published an order of the Moft Christian King at Nancy, by which he cormands his Tipops to continue to treat all those that are in the fervice of the Duke of Lorrain as Enemies, for that he has refused to have part in the Peace concluded with the Emperor.

Cologne, May 9. Yellerday was published at Urdinghen the prol ngation of the Celfati n between France and the Elector of Brandenburg, till he 20th inflant, and the Bridge which the French have made there, is ordered to be removed to Wefel, which place as well as Lipstadt are to be garifond by the French till the Peace be made. From Strasburg we have an account, that the Duke of Lorraun had proposed to the States of Franconia, the keeping a conflant Force for their fecurity against all sudden attempts, which they were deliberating upor. The Bilhop of Strasburg is expected to morrow at Liege and will be here some time the next week. It is belierved he will renew his pretension to the Coad, utor thip of this See.

Hamburg, May 9. The news we had of the death of the King of Sueden is now contradicted by leveral Letters from Denmark; but that which ftill makes fime people doubtful, is the great ftrictnels, with which the Suedes deny all perfons to come into their Camp; but that may be occafioned by fome Enterprize they have in hand, which they would keep from the Enemies having any notice of. Monfeir Rabenae the French Minilter is returned to Zell, whicher Monfieur Buckwaldt is likewife gone on the part of the King of Denmark,

Bruffels, May 12. On Friday laft arrived hore, Mareichal d'Estrades from Nimeguen, and yesterday he parted again from hence on his way to Paris. Don Emanuel de Lyra is likewise arrived here from the Hague; it is thought he comes to confult his Excellency in the matter concerning Maestricht, which he has made very prefing inflances to the States about, but hitherto without any success. From Nimeguen they write, that the Peace between France and the Elector of Brandenburg, was lookt upon to be asgood as concluded.

Nimeguen, May 11. Yesterday arrived here the Sieur Meinders, with the Character of Envoy from the Elector of Brandenburg; it is believed he comes fully infructed and empowered to conclude jointly with Monfieur Blajpeil (who has been here during the whole Congress in quality of his El croral Highness's Ambassador,) the Peace of the North, for as much as concerns their Mafter, who it's faid is willing to part with Sterin, together with his other Conquests; and in confideration there f is to receive 600000 Crowns. The 9th instant Wefel was delivered by Lieutenant-General Spaen into the hands of the French, he having first removed the Artillery, Ammunition, and other Military Previfions that were there, to Minden and ot] e -places.

Hague, May 12. The States have upon the re-peated in lances of Monfieur d'Avaux the French Ambaffador, finally refolved to reffore to the Jefuires the Church and part of the Colledge at Maeliricht, which they were posselled of in 1632. and now at the time when the French quitted that City. The French Ambalfador hath by a Memorial acquainted the States, that the Elector of Brandenburg had offered to put not only Wefel and Lipstadt, but likewife schenfcans into the hands of the King his Mafter, which his Majelly had refuled, becaufe he would not give any jealoufie to this State. We underfland from Nimeguen, that the Suedes Ambaffadors there have Letters from Sueden of a very freih date, figned by the King himfelf, which perfectly difcredits what has been faid of his leath, though the Letters from Copenhagen still fay, that the Country people that came from Schonen continue to report it.

Paris, May 15. The 13 inftant Monficur de Fillars took his leave of the King, in order to his beginning his journey for Spain, whither he gees in quality of Amballador Extraordinary. There is There is now no more discourse at Court of the Kings progress, which it's therefore believed, is put off. The udges appointed by the King for the Tryal of the Perions acculed of Poyfonings, have proceeded to give Judgment upon several, of which three were executed on Wednefday laft, to wit, two Women and a Youth, one of the Women was burnt alive, but the other with the Youth, were first hanged, and then burnt, and a Girl of 12 or 13 years, was burnt in the back, and banifhed the Kingdom. From the Rhine we have advice, that the Sieur Calvo had put a Garifon of 4000 men into Wefel, and had fent 2000 more to Lipstadt likewife to poffes themfelves of that place; which two places are to remain in the hands of our King till the Peace between him and the Brandenburg is concluded, which we now expect will be very fuddenly.

Plimouth, May 4. This day arrived here the Greenwich and Dartmouth Frigats, with feveral Mer.* chant Ships from the Canaries, having been pat for Ireland.
