The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 3d of May last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the 7th Day of this instant November: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this instant November, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot Ash or Pearl Ash, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all " Persons who have been concerned in advising " or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords " Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury respect-" ing the Exportation of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; " for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame; " for authorizing His Majesty to prohibit the Ex-" portation or carrying Coastwife of Pot-Ashes or " Pearl-Ashes, and for making further Provisions " relative thereto." But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid
