YOU will receive herewith a Letter from Lord Henry Paulet, Captain of His Majefty's Ship Thalia, acquainting me of his having, on the 10th Ultimo, captured L'Espoir French Corvette, of 16 Guns.

Thalia, 'at Sea, September 11, 1797.

SIR YESTERDAY Evening, being in Latitude 34 deg. 27 min. N. and Longitude 29 deg. 40 min. W. I captured the French National Corvette L'Efpoir, mounting 16 Six-Pounders, and having 96 Men; the comes from Cayenne, and was cruizing with another Corvette, which was taken the 20th Ultimo by an English Frigate.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Gore, Commander of His Majesty's Ship the Triton, to Admiral Lord Bridport, dated at Sea, October 23, 1797.

My Lord.

I Have the Honor to inform your Lordship, that I this Day chased and captured, close in with Abbruaak, the Furet French Schooner Privateer, mounting 4 Guns, Four-Pounders, but pierced for 14, having 53 Men on Board ; Twenty-three Days out from Treguier, and had only taken the Denton English Brig, laden with Coals, which was retaken the next Day by His Majesty's Ship Jason.
