As several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Arthers and Manufacturers, Sungest of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercife their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majestics King George the First and Second and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of Perfons who may be imported of the Penalties, they may incorporate the information they may incorporate the penalties that they are the penalties they are they are the penalties they are they ar may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artisicers or Manufacturers'themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Performance of the state of the sta fon having been once convicted shall offend again he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned
