

Whitehall, January 19, 1798.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that Two anonymous threatening Letters have been addressed to the Duke of Richmond, one of which was hung up on the Pales of John Shakspear, Esq; at Singleton, and the other inclosed in a Letter to George Francis Tyson, Esq; at Drought, containing Threats to kill the said Duke and Three of his Gamekeepers, and to destroy and burn his Woods and Plantations, and destroy Mr. Tyson's Plantations; and that the Writers would "do for" the Farmers, and destroy their Property and that of the Millers; and that they could raise Forty Poachers any Night.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and sending the Letters above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person or Persons who actually wrote and sent the said Letters) who shall discover his, her or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
