RESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Trade-" between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the " West India Islands, and the Countries belonging es to the United States of America, and between " His Majesty's faid Subjects and the Foreign Islands " in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to impower the Governor of Newfoundfand for the Time being to authorize, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then ensuing Season only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law. And whereas it is expedient and necessary

bitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn and Live Stock be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships owned by His Majeily's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which shall, within the Space of Seven Months previous to the Time of such Importation, have cleared out from some Port in Great Britain, or some other Port of His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form herein after mentioned; which Licences shall continue and be in Force for Seven Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which they are respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-eight, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, That the Master, or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Vessel at the that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inha- | Port, Harbour or Place in the Island of NewfoundIndian Corn and Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorsed on the Back of such Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned. Extract of a Letter from Captain Digby, of His Majesty's Ship Aurora, to Admiral Earl of St. Vincent, dated the 26th of January, 1798.

Have the Honor to acquaint you, that I captured, on the 17th Instant, to the Westward of Cape Finisterre, La Casualided Spanish Letter of Marque, (Schooner rigged) mounting 6 Guns and 17 Men, Don Ysidro Orneze, Commander; Forty-seven Days from Caraccas, with a Cargo of Cocoa.

SIR

DLEASE to lay before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty the accompanying Letter to me from Captain Fraier, of His Majesty's Ship Shannon, giving Account of his having captured, off Cape Clear, on the 2d Instant, a large French Ship Privateer, mounting 24 Guns and 150 Men, with which he arrived here last Evening.

She at first hoisted English Colours, but on the Shannon's firing a Shot towards her, she hauled them down, housted the National Flag, and fired her Stern Chaces, continuing to do fo (without Effect) until the Shannon's Shot fell far beyond her, when she struck her Colours, and brought to at Five P. M.

She is called Le Duguay Trouin, a Privateer of St. Malo, commanded by Citizen Legue, mounting 24 Six-Pounders, several of which were thrown overboard during the Chace, and armed with 150

Men.

She failed from St. Malo the 3d of November, but having been forced into the River Benois, in Brittany, by bad Weather, the had been only Eight Days from thence; the had taken nothing until early in the Morning of the Day I fell in with her, when the captured the Wilding, of Liverpool, Henry Ward, Master, from Jamaica, 23 of whose Crew I found on Board her. I have to regret the extreme Haziness of the Weather all Day, which prevented any Object from being seen at more than Four or Five Miles Distance, otherwise I think I must have seen and recaptured that Ship; but it blowing very fresh at Well, it was late in the Night before the Prize could be fecured and the Prisoners shifted, which having done, I thought it necessary, from the Number on Board, and the State of the Shannon's Rigging, which had suffered much in the late Gales, to proceed for this Port.

Le Duguay Trouin is 112 Feet long on the Gun Deck, and 30 Feet broad; she is very well found in every Thing as a Privateer, and fails fast.
