

HIS Day the Lords being met, a Meffage was fent to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by Mr. Quarme, the Yeoman Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by wirtue of His Majefty's Commission for declaring His Royal Affent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable Houfe in the Houfe of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, and for appointing other Commissioners; together with those named in the first mentioned Act to put in Execution an Act of this Session of Parliament, for granting an Aid to His Majesty, by a Land Tax to be railed in Great Britain, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, and for indemnifying such Persons as have acted as Commissioners for executing the faid Act for granting an Aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax to be railed in Great Britain for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven.
