Lubeck, July 24. We are here in a continual slarner, occal oned by the neighborhood of the Danith Troops. This morning a Lunenburg Regiment pathed through this City, being to guard the Avenues of the Territory of this City. Strasburg, July 24. Part of the Imperial Army,

Strasburg, July 24. Part of the Imperial Army, viz, the Regiments of Montecucu'i, Rabbata, Caprara. and Harrant, are on their march towards Bohemia, and it's hoped they will be followed by the reit of the Imperial Troops, that fo the French may not have a presence to vex us any longer by remaining in the Empire. The French have finished the new Canal, from the Mountains to Schlestadt.

Cologne, July 18. The Prince of Furflemberg purpoles to part hence the beginning of the next week. The States of *Berg* and *Juliers* are at prefent assembled to raile Subbdies for their Duke.

Cologne, Aug. 4. The fecond inflant Signior Bevilacqua the Popes Nuncio arrived here from Ni meguen, with intention to remain fome time in this City. On Monday next the Imperial Troops that are at Bonne, will march from thence, and at the fame time those of our Elector will enter into it; all the French Troops, which were in this Dioceis, are drawing together at Berchem, four Leagues from hence, and we have an account that there are already 12 Regiments. The Marcfehal de (requi encamped the fecond inflant near Lipfladt, in his return towards the Reine. The States of the Dutchy of Berg and fuliers, at prefent alfembled at Dujeldorp, have refolved to fend Deputies to the Marc'chal de Crequi, to offer him a Sum of Mony, in cafe he will not march his Forces through those Countries.

Bruffels, Aug. 8. On Saturday his Excellency begun his journy for Luxemburg, where he will flay till the end of this month. The fame day Monfieur Colbert, the French Ambaffador arrived here, and parted again the next day on his way to Paris. The Magistrates of Antwerp have published & Placaet, by which they grant to all English Merchants as shall come and relide there, an immunity from all Taxes, Cultoms, and other Duties. The Congress at Nimeguen is quite broken up, the few Ambassadors that remain there, being now upon their departure. From Mentz of the 30th paft they write, that that Elector, upon the reiterated inflances of the French Miniflers, had obliged the Lorrain Troops to retire out of his Territories, and that they were accordingly on their march towards Philipsburg, to join the Imperialists that are drawing together there, in order to their marching to the Emperors Hereditary Countries. Our Letters from Cologne of the fourth inftant fay, that the Imperial Garilon at Bonne had received orders to leave that place, and that Monday last was appointed for the doing of it; that fo foon as the Imperial Troops were marche.l out, those of the Elector would take their place, and that the Elector would follow in perfon in very few days; that the French Army under the c mmand of the Marcschal de Crequi, continues its march towards the Rhine.

Hague, Aug. 4. The States-General having received the advice of the feveral Provinces, have refolved to ratifie the peace lately concluded by their Commiltioners, with those of Argiers; and in confideration thereof, to prefent them with 8 pice's of Cannon, carrying Ball of 36 and 40 I. with Bullet and Powder proportionable. The States have left it to the Prince of Orange to give the neceffary Orders for the final furthement of matters, as well ed.

Civil as Ecclefiaflical at Maesiricht; the O-ders that have been hitherto given, being only provide onal. The States having received advice from Iriejland, that a Lody of 15000 men, belonging to the Bithop of Munfter, were on their march-towards that Province, provided with all things necessary for a Siege, and that 5000 men more were expected to joyn them; the Prince of Orange has islued his Orders for the putting things in fuch a pofture as may fecure the quist of that Province. Our French Letters tell us, that Monfi ur de Pompone hath acquainted the Ambafladors of this State, that in cafe the Spaniards did not within the year limited by the late Treaty of Peace between the two Crowns, obtain the confent of the Prince of Liege, to yield Dinant tothe molt Christian King, his Ma elty would make use of his Arms to possels him elf of Charlemont; upon which, the D puties of the State have had a conference with Monfieur de Lyra the Spanish Minister. The States of Holland are separated, and will not meet again till about the middle of September.

Hague, Aug. 8. The pretentions of this State upon Spain, on account of the Moneys disburfed for the fervice of that Grown, in the Equipage made here during the War, mount to high, that its believed they will not be fuddainly fatisfied; Don Emanuel de Lyra is preparing for his departure, having taken his have of the Prince, who is gone for Divren. The 4 inflant arrived here Henry Sidney Efg. Brother to the Earl of Leicefler, Envoye Extraordinary from His Majelly of Great Fritain to this tate. We hear nothing farther of the Munfler Troops, and people are very much troubled to find out the reation of their drawing together, in to confiderable a body, upon the frontiers of this State. The Bifhop of Ofnibrug is at prefent with his Duchefs at Amjlerdam, incognico.

Portsmouth, Fuly 31. Yesterday arrived here the Antelope from the Downs, and this day set sail again with the Dover for New foundland.
