Copy of a Letter from Vice Admiral Kingfmill, Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels on the Coaft of Ireland, to Evan Nepean, Ejq; dated Cove of Cork, the 6th Inftant.

SIR, Herewith transmit, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter to me from the Hon. Captain De Courcy, of His Majesty's Ship Magnanime, containing Particulars of the Capture of Two French Privateers.

Magnanime, Cork Harbour, April 6, 1798. S I R,

I Avail myfelf of the earlieft Means of acquainting you, that when the Service, affigned to me by your Order of the 6th of March, had been nearly accomplifhed, Chace was given by His Majefty's Ship under my. Command to a French Privateer Brig, which, at the Diftance of about Five Miles, was, on the Dawn of the 16th of the fame Month, obferved to hawl athwart the Fore Foot of the little Convoy fubmitted to my Guidance.

The Gale being fresh, and favourable to the Magnanime's best failing, it was trusted she would very speedily arrive up with the Object of Pursuit; but that End was not attained till, at the Expiration of Twenty-three Hours, a Space had been run of Two Hundred and Fisty-fix Miles, although the Privateer had, in her Flight, given a very manifest Advantage, by steering in a circuitous Maoner.

rantage, by fleering in a circuitous Manner. The Satisfaction of capturing fo faft failing a Privateer has been much encreafed by a Knowledge, fubfequently obtained, of it's having been the Defign of her Commander, in a Confidence of his Veffel's unrivalled failing, to hover round the Convoy till a favourable Moment fhould occur for attacking it's least protected Part. The Privateer is named L'Eugenic, was captured in Latitude 42 and Longitude 12, was manned, when chaced, with 107 Men, and armed with 18 Guns, 8 of which appear to have been thrown overboard whilit preffed in the Purfuit.

Under fimilar Circumitances of Wind and Weather, Purfuit was again given, by the Ship under my Command; to a Ship which reconnoitred us, early on the Morning of the 1ft of April.

The Chace was continued with doubtful Effect for fome Time, when at length, after a Purfuit of One Hundred and Eighty Miles, in Eighteen Hours, fhe made a Signal of furrendering. Her Force confifted of 20 Guns, (but pierced for 22) and 137 Men, and, like L'Eugenie, appears to be coppered and perfectly new. Her Name L'Audacieux.

The Eafe with which the ran round us, within Six Hours after being taken Possefilien of, manifested how much we were indebted for the Capture of her to her very bad steering. Sixteen of her Guns were thrown overboard during the Chace.

I Have the Honor to inform you, that this Evening, Oftend bearing S. S. E. 7 Leagues, I fell in with and captured the Sans Pariel French Schooner Privateer, mounting I Six Pounder and Eight Swivel Guns, manned with 21 Men, and commanded by Monf. Jacques Francois Doré, from Oftend this Day, had not taken any Thing.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Thomas Campbell, Commander of His Majefty's armed Veffel the Wright, to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated at North Shields, the 8th Inftant.

SIR,

YOU will be pleafed to acquaint my Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, that I Yefferday, about 6 Leagues from Huntcliff, recaptured the Three Brigs named in the Margin\*, laden with Coals, who had been taken by a French Privateer the fame Morning: About Three o'Clock, the Veffels being all fecured, I gave Chace to the Privateer, who was running to the North Eaft, and being highly favoured by the Winds, had the Pleafure to take her at Half paft Six; fhe proved to be the Merveilleufe Schooner Privateer, of Dunkirk, commanded by Pierre Lefevre, mounting 6 Guns (5 of which were thrown overboard in the Chacc) and 39 Men. She had been Eight Days from Dunkirk, and had taken only One, a Brig laden with Coals, the Day before we fell in with her.
