*Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir Hyde Parker, Knt. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Jamaica, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated on Board the Queen, Cape Nicola Mole, March 12, 1798.*

Herewith you will receive, for their Lordships Information, a List of such Armed Vessels, &c. as have been captured by the Ships and Vessels under my Command since my last Return.

*A List of Armed Vessels captured and destroyed by His Majesty's Squadron under my Command, since the 29th of October, 1797.*

A French Schooner Privateer, of 10 Guns, destroyed.—By the Jamaica.

La Fortunee French Schooner Privateer, of 2 Four-Pounders, captured.—By the Jamaica.

Le Petit Resource French Privateer, of 3 Three-Pounder and 2 Swivels, captured.—By the Swallow.

La Creole French Schooner Privateer, of 6 Guns, and a Cargo, captured.—By the Ceres.

Le Brutus French Privateer, of 9 Guns, captured.—By La Magicienne, Regulus and Diligence.

A French Schooner Privateer, captured.—By the Gannett Cutter.

A Privateer, captured.—By the Recovery Schooner. La Magicienne French Ship Privateer, of 16 Guns and 178 Tons, captured.—By the Valiant and Squadron.

A Spanish Schooner Pacquet, armed with Swivels, and with a Cargo, captured, together with Four Spanish Brigs, loaded with Hides, Tallow, Dying Woods, and a great Quantity of Gunpowder, &c.—By the Squadron.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that about Eight o'Clock on the Evening of Tuesday the 3d Instant, as John Mellish, Esq; accompanied by Two other Gentlemen, were returning to London, in a Post-Chaise, from Salt Hill, they were attacked by Two or more Footpads near the Magpies on Hounslow Heath; and that before and after robbing these Gentlemen, the said Footpads had the Turpitude to fire Three Pistols into the Chaise, a Ball from one of which entered the Forehead of the said Mr. Mellish, and soon afterwards deprived him of his Life.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the atrocious Murder and Robbery above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually shot the said Mr. Mellish)
