SEVERAL Persons, whose Names are thereunto subscribed, on Behalf of themselves and others, Burgesses of the Borough of Malmesbury in the County of Wilts, having this Day presented their Petition to the House of Commons, setting forth, that on the Tenth Day of May, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, the Select Committee, appointed to try the Merits of the Petition presented by James John Vassar, Esq; complaining of an undue Election and Return for the said Borough, reported to the House, That it appeared to the said Select Committee, that the Merits of the Petition did wholly depend upon the Right of Election; and that thereupon the said Committee required the Counsel for the several Parties to deliver to the Clerk to the said Committee Statements in Writing of the Right of Election for which they respectively contended: That in consequence thereof, the Counsel for the Petitioner delivered in a Statement as follows: "That the Right of Election for Members to serve in Parliament for the Borough of Malmesbury in the County of Wilts is in the Alderman, Capital Burgesses, Assistants, Landholders, and Commoners of the said Borough." That the Counsel for the Sitting Member, Philip Metcalf, Esq; delivered in a Statement as follows: "That the Right of Election of Burgesses to serve in Parliament for the Borough of Malmesbury in the County of Wilts is in the Alderman and Twelve Capital Burgesses only." That upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the Petitioner, the said Select Committee had determined, That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is not the Right of Election for the said Borough of Malmesbury: That upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the Sitting Member the said Select Committee had determined, That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is the Right of Election for the said Borough of Malmesbury. That the Petitioners believe, and are advised, that the Right of Election, so determined by the said Select Committee, is not the Right of Election for the said Borough; and therefore, to prevent the Judgment of the said Select Committee from becoming final and conclusive, the Petitioners pray, that they may be admitted as Parties, according to the Form of the Statute in that Case made and provided, to oppose the Right of Election, in Favour of which the said Select Committee have so reported, and that they may have such other Relief in the Premises as to the House shall seem meet, and the Nature of their Case may require. I do hereby give Notice, that the House has appointed Monday the Eleventh Day of June next, at Three of the Clock in the Afternoon, to take the said Pe-
