THE Prince of Wales has been graciously pleased to signify his Commands to the Council of His Royal Highness, that Renewals of the Leasehold and Copyhold Estates of the Duchy of Cornwall shall pass, WITHOUT FINE, for replacing any Life or Lives that may happen to be lost thereon, in the Defence of the Country, in case of an Invasion.
