An AA for continuing, until the First Day of June, One thousand Eight Hundred and Twelve, and from thence to the End of the then next Selfion of Parliament, an Act paffed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, to prevest Frauds and Abufes in the Admeasurement of Coals fold by Wharf Measure within the City of Lo. don and the Liberties thereof, and between Tower Dock and Limehoufe-hole, in the County of Middlefex.

An Act for encouraging the Art of making new Models and Catts of Bufts, and other Things therein mentioned.

An Act for further continuing for Thirty-eight Years, the Term granted by an Act of the Twentyfifth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the Second, for continuing the Duty of Two Pennies Scots upon every Pint of Ale and Beer fold in the City of Edinburgh, and Places adjacent, for the Purpofes therein mentioned, and for explaining and amending the faid Act.

An Act for draining, preferving, and improving the Low Grounds and Carrs, lying in the feveral Parithes, Lordhips, Townships, Hamlets, Precincts, and Territories of Beverley, Saint John of Beverley, Grovehill, Saudholme, Storkhill, Molefcroft, Leckonfield, Arram, Scorbrough, Lockingten, Ayke, Befwick, Wiltholme, Kilnwick, Watton, Hutton-Cranfwick, Rotfea, Featherholme, Skerne, Brig-ham, Fitholme, Nafferton, Lowthorpe, Harpham, Little Kalk, Fofton, Burton-Agnes, Granfmoor, Liffet, Barmfton, Ulram, otherwife Owram, Shiplea, Dringhoe, Beeford, North Frodingham, Brandes-Burton, Moor-Town, Leven, Emmotland, Hemphole ", Goodhill-houfe, and Struncheon-hill, all in the East Riding of the Cou ty of York.

An Act to alter and enlarge the Powers of an Act paffed in the Thirty-fixth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, intituled, an Act for building a Bridge over the River Itchin, at or near Northam, within the Liberties of the Town and County of the Town of Southampton; and for making a Road from the faid Town to the faid Bridge, and from thence to communicate with the Road leading from West End to Bodey, in the County of Southampton.

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Sellion of Parliament, the Term, and altering the Powers of Two feveral Acts, the one passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majelty King George the Second, and the other in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for amending and keeping in Repair the Roads leading from a Place called Friar Bacon's Study to Chilton Pond, and from the Top of Hinckfey Hill to Foxcombe Hill Gate, in the Road Lading to Farringdon, in the County of Berks, fo far as the fame relates to the Oxford Diffrict of the faid Roads therein mentioned.

An 4ct for more effectually repairing, widening, and improving the Road from Tetbury, in the County of Gloucester, to and through Malmesbury, to the Chutchway in Lower Stanton Field, in the County of Wilts, there to join the Turnpike Road leading from Chippenham Bridge to Lower Stanton aforefaid, and from Malmefbury to the Turnpike Road, at or near Jackament's Bottom, in the faid County of Gloucefter, and alfo the Road from Far-ringdon to Cricklade, from thence to Malmefbury,

I and to the Turnpike Road at Acton Turville, and also from Sherstone to the Tur pike Road leading from Tetbury to Bath ; and for making, maintaining, widening, and improving feveral other Roads communicating therewith. An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years,

and from thence to the End of the then next Sollion of Parliament, and rendering more effectual feveral Acts for repairing the Road from the Golden Far-mer, near Bagfhot, in the County of Surrey, to Hartford Bridge Hill, in the County of Southampton, and from thence to Basingstoke and Odiham, both in the faid County of Southampton, and for repair. ing and widening the Road from the Southern Extremity of Northwarnborough lane, near Odiham aforefaid, over Northwarnborough Common, Hook Common, and Bartley Heath, and through the Parishes of Rotherwicke, Martingley, and Heckfield, to a Place called the Buil Ion, in the Parish of Swallowfield, on the Turnpike Road leading from the Town of Reading, in the County of Berks, to Basingitoke aforelaid.
