**ARMORIAL BEARING TAX.**

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, June 30, 1798.

**HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties, do hereby give Notice, that Armorial Bearing Certificates, COMMENCING THE 25th OF JUNE, 1798, AND ENDING THE 24th OF JUNE, 1799, are now granting, and will continue so to be, at the following Offices or Places, until Saturday the 25th of August ensuing, inclusive, UPON PAYMENT OF THE RESPECTIVE DUTIES ONLY, viz.**

- 2l. 2s. by any Person keeping a Coach or other Carriage, upon which any Duty under the Management of the Commissioners for the Affairs of Taxes is chargeable, and on which any Armorial Bearing, or Ensign, shall be painted, marked, or affixed.
- 1l. 1s. by any Person not keeping any such Coach or other Carriage; who shall be charged to the Duties on Inhabited Houses, or on Houses, Windows, or Lights, by any Act passed in the present Session of Parliament.
- 10s. 6d. by any Person not keeping any such Coach or other Carriage, nor being charged to the said Duties on Inhabited Houses, or on Houses, Windows, or Lights.

**THE Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have given Directions for paying off such Exchequer-Bills issued pursuant to an Act of the last Session of Parliament, "for raising a further Sum of Money by Loans or Exchequer-Bills for the Service of the Year 1798," as were charged on the 3d Instalment of the Loan granted by an Act of the same Session, "for raising the Sum of 17,000,000l: by Way of Annuities;" and which were not paid in on the said Instalment, and that the Principal and Interest on such Bills shall be paid at the Exchequer-Bill Office in Saint Margaret's-Street, between the Two Palace-Yards, Westminster, on Monday the 9th of July next, and Attendance will be given on Monday next the 2d July and every succeeding Day until Saturday the 7th Day of July inclusive, from Ten o'Clock in the Morning till One in the Afternoon (Sundays and Holidays excepted) for that Purpose: And for the greater Dispatch, the Bearers of the said Bills are desired to bring Lists thereof, containing the Numbers in Numerical Order, according to the Value of the said Bills, Times of Commencement of Interest, with the Principal Sums and Interest due on such Bills, to be computed at Three Pence Halfpenny by the Day on every 100l. from the Time of Commencement to the 9th Day of July next, on which Day the Interest on the said Exchequer-Bills will cease.
