*Copy of a Letter from the Earl of St. Vincent, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Mediterranean, to Evan Nepean Esq. dated on board the Ville de Paris, off Cadiz, the 8th of June, 1798.*

SIR,  
HEREWITH I transmit Captain Luke's Letter of the 27th ult. acquainting me with the Capture of La Zenodone, French Polacca Privateer.

*Caroline, Rosier Bay, May 29, 1798.*

My Lord,  
I BEG leave to inform your Lordship, that on the 23d instant, Cape Palos bearing N. by E. Distance six Leagues, I fell in with and captured La Zenodone, French Polacca Privateer, mounting two Sixes, six Fours, and two Three-Pounders, carrying 61 Men, commanded by Captain Coffon, from Carthage, out 22 Days, but had not taken any Thing.

PURSUANT to the Directions of an Act of Parliament made, and passed in the Thirty-eighth Year of His present Majesty, entitled "An Act for the better Protection of the Trade of this Kingdom, and for granting New and Additional Duties of Customs on Goods imported and exported, and on the Tonnage of certain Ships entering Outwards or Inwards, to or from Foreign Parts, until the signing the preliminary Articles of Peace," Cap. 76. Sec. the 9th. The Lords Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, &c. do hereby give Notice, that from and after the Date hereof, all Masters and other Persons having the Charge or Command of any Ships or Vessels, which are by the said Act required not to sail or depart without Convoy, are to have on board their respective Ships or Vessels, Six Yards of Red, the same Quantity of Blue; and the

same Quantity of White Bunting, to be made into such Flags or Vanes as shall be directed by the Captain, or other Officer in His Majesty's Navy entrusted with the Care of such Convoy, for the Purpose of distinguishing such Ships or Vessels; and of enabling such Masters or other Persons to answer the Signal or Signals made by such Officer; and that such Flags or Vanes are to be provided by such Masters or other Persons having the Charge and Command of any Ships or Vessels which are required by the said Act not to sail without Convoy.

ARMORIAL BEARING TAX.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, June 30, 1798.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties, do hereby give Notice, that Armorial Bearing Certificates, COMMENCING THE 25th OF JUNE, 1798, AND ENDING THE 24th OF JUNE, 1799, are now granting, and will continue so to be, at the following Offices or Places, until Saturday the 25th of August ensuing; inclusive; UPON PAYMENT OF THE RESPECTIVE DUTIES ONLY, viz.

- 2l. 2s. by any Person keeping a Coach or other Carriage; upon which any Duty under the Management of the Commissioners for the Affairs of Taxes is chargeable, and on which any Armorial Bearing, or Ensign, shall be painted, marked, or affixed.
- 1l. 1s. by any Person not keeping any such Coach or other Carriage; who shall be charged to the Duties on Inhabited Houses; or on Houses, Windows, or Lights, by any Act passed in the present Session of Parliament.
- 10s. 6d. by any Person not keeping any such Coach or other Carriage, nor being charged to the said Duties on Inhabited Houses, or on Houses, Windows, or Lights.
