IN Purfuance of the Directions of an AA paffed in the Twenty-fourth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty King George the Third, inti-tuled, "An Act to repeal fo much of Two Acts " made in the Tenth and Fifteenth Years of the " Reign of His prefent Majefty as authorizes the "Speaker of the Houfe of Commons to illue his " Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out " Writs for the Election of Members to ferve in Par-" liament in the Manner therein mentioned, and for " fubflituting other Provisions for the like Pur-"pofes;" I do hereby give Notice, that the Death of James Adair, Efq; late Member of Parliament for the Borough of Higham Ferrers, in the County of Northampton, hath been certified to me in Writing, under the Hands of Two Members of Parliament; and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new Writ for the electing of a Burgefs to ferve in this prefent Parliament for the faid Borough, in the Room of the faid James Adair, Efq; at the End of Fourteen Days after the Infertion of this Notice in the Gazette. Whitehall, August II. As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercife their feveral Callings, contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms, the follow-ing Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience. to them : And it will be observed, that such are such are such are such are such are the them in the such are the such are the them in the such are the such as the such are the such are the such as the such are the such are the such are the such as the such are such as the such are such as the such are such as the such as the such are such as the such are the such as the such are such as the such are such as the such that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or infrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Infiruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufasturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfor having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Arti-ficers, Thall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minifter or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any. Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, Devife, or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpofes afore-faid, fuch Juiltice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he fhall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpofe aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as luch Court shall think reafonable, and fhall be imprifoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13. IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotto feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufac-tures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and fhall be convicted, upon In-dictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Weftminfter, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence fhall be committed in Eng-land, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufticiary land, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufticiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ire-land; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Impri-fonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture
